HOUSE BILL 1920

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE SOUTH ARKANSAS COMMUNITY
10 COLLEGE FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1995; AND
11 FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE SOUTH ARKANSAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE
15 APPROPRIATION."

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for South
20 Arkansas Community College for the 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum
21 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions
22 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201
23 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,
24 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set
25 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
26 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
27 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
28 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
29 successor.

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23 SECTION 5. PRIORITIES. A high priority of South Arkansas Community
24 College shall be the combatting of illiteracy and the providing of industrial
25 training, in the work place.

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27 SECTION 6. The appropriation level provided in Section 3 of this Act
28 shall not be construed as a commitment of the Arkansas General Assembly to
29 provide a particular level of support from the Work Force 2000 Development
30 Fund for the South Arkansas Community College but rather that the funds to be
31 made available are to be based upon legitimate criteria and accreditation
32 requirements as determined by the State Board of Higher Education for all
33 technical colleges.

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35 SECTION 7. HOUSING ALLOWANCE. Upon approval by the South Arkansas

1 *Community College Board of Trustees, the President of South Arkansas Community*
2 *College may receive a housing allowance in an amount not to exceed four-*
3 *hundred dollars (\$400) per month in lieu of college housing.*

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5 SECTION 8. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
6 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
7 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
8 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
9 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
10 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions
11 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where
12 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
13 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
14 disbursement of said funds.

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16 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
17 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
18 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
19 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
20 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
21 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
22 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
23 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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25 SECTION 10. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
26 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and
27 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

28

29 SECTION 11. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
30 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
31 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
32 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
33 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

34

35 SECTION 12. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict

1 with this Act are hereby repealed.

2

3 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
4 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
5 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
6 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1993 is essential to the operation of
7 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
8 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
9 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1993 could work irreparable harm upon the
10 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
11 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
12 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
13 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1993.
