## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND  
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION FOR  
10 THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1995; AND FOR OTHER  
11 PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION APPROPRIATION."

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

18 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - INMATE CARE AND CUSTODY. There is hereby  
19 established for the Department of Correction - Inmate Care and Custody for the  
20 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose  
21 salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and  
22 Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all  
23 laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a  
24 specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt  
25 from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All  
26 persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the  
27 provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas  
28 Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

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18 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - INMATE CARE AND CUSTODY. There is hereby  
19 authorized, for the Department of Correction - Inmate Care and Custody for the  
20 1993-95 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary  
21 employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein  
22 for such purposes: Forty (40) temporary or part-time employees, when needed,  
23 at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and  
24 Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate  
25 classification.

27 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS - INMATE CARE AND CUSTODY. There is hereby  
28 appropriated, to the Department of Correction, to be payable from the  
29 Department of Correction Inmate Care and Custody Fund Account, for personal  
30 ~~services and operating expenses of the Department of Correction - Inmate Care~~

24 SECTION 8. REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES. Upon determination by the Board  
25 of Correction and Community Punishment that a reallocation of resources within  
26 the Department of Community Punishment and Department of Correction is  
27 necessary for the efficient and effective operation of the departments, the  
28 Board, with approval of the Governor and review by the Arkansas Legislative  
29 Council or Joint Budget Committee, shall have the authority to instruct the  
30 department directors, to request from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a  
31 transfer of positions, programs, funds, appropriations, and line-item  
32 appropriations within or between existing and newly created divisions,  
33 offices, sections, or units of the departments. If it is determined that the  
34 requested transfer should be made, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall  
35 then initiate the necessary transfer documents to reflect the transfers upon

1 the fiscal records of the State Treasurer, the State Auditor, the Chief Fiscal  
2 Officer of the State, and the Departments of Correction and Community  
3 Punishment.

4

5 SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Governor  
6 shall initially appoint the Director of the Department of Correction after  
7 which the Board of Correction and Community Punishment shall appoint the  
8 Director of the Department with the advice of the Governor.

9

10

11 SECTION 10. Arkansas Code §19-5-302 is hereby amended as follows:

12 "(1) (A) DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION INMATE CARE AND CUSTODY FUND ACCOUNT. The  
13 Department of Correction Inmate Care and Custody Fund Account shall be used  
14 for the maintenance, operation, and improvement of the Department of  
15 Correction required in carrying out those powers, functions, and duties  
16 relating to nonfarm or crop-producing programs as established by law.

17 (B) The fund account shall consist of:

18 (i) Those general revenues as may be provided by law;

19 (ii) Nonrevenue income derived from services provided by the inmate care and  
20 custody program;

21 (iii) Excess farm profits as may be provided by law; and

22 (iv) Any other funds provided by law."

23

24 SECTION 11. Such appropriations, funding and regular employees as may be  
25 authorized by the 79th General Assembly for the biennial period ending June  
26 30, 1995, for the personal services and operating expenses of the Department  
27 of Correction as created in Act 549 of 1993, shall hereby be made available to  
28 the Department of Correction as currently established in law, until such time  
29 as the provisions of Act 549 are effective.

30

31 SECTION 12. APPROPRIATIONS - PRISON INDUSTRY. There is hereby  
32 appropriated, to the Department of Correction, to be payable from the  
33 Department of Correction Prison Industry Fund, for personal services and  
34 operating expenses of the Department of Correction - Prison Industry for the  
35 biennial period ending June 30, 1995, the following:

20 SECTION 18. The proceeds from the sale of feeder cattle by the  
21 Department of Correction shall be deposited into the State Treasury as a  
22 refund to expenditure to the credit of the appropriation available to the  
23 Department of Correction for the "Purchase of Feeder Cattle for Slaughter".

25 SECTION 19. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or departmental  
26 commitment which may exist to the contrary, the State Board of Correction  
27 shall not increase any reimbursement rate for payments made to any county for  
28 the purpose of reimbursing the expenses of the care and custody of state  
29 inmates, without first seeking and receiving the approval of the Governor and  
30 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

31  
32 ~~SECTION 20. USE OF MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION APPROPRIATION AND SALVAGED~~  
33 MATERIALS CONSTRUCTION. The Department of Correction is hereby authorized to  
34 utilize Maintenance and General Operation Appropriation in conjunction with  
35 surplus and/or salvageable materials for the purpose of implementing

1 construction projects to benefit the Department and its various programs.  
2 Before such projects may be undertaken, a Method of Finance must be submitted  
3 for prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council, and review and approval  
4 by the Department of Finance and Administration and the Arkansas State  
5 Building Services.

7 SECTION 21. EXTRA SALARIES. There is hereby authorized, for the  
8 Department of Correction, for the 1993-95 biennium, the following increases in  
9 salaries for certain positions provided in the Regular Salary schedule in this  
10 Act, and to be in addition to the annual amounts as established by the Uniform  
11 Classification and Compensation Act, as amended, for three (3) full-time  
12 physicians who are certified by the American Specialty Boards at rates of pay  
13 not to exceed an additional \$4,500 per year. If certified in forensic  
14 psychiatry, an additional \$2,500 per year will be allowed. Total extra  
15 salaries may not exceed \$7,000 per year per position. In the event the  
16 physician is not a full time employee, the amount specified herein shall be  
17 adjusted proportionately to the amount of time worked for the Department of  
18 Correction by that physician.

19  
20 SECTION 22. It is hereby authorized that the Department of Correction  
21 may move an incumbent classified as a Correctional Officer I, Grade 16, up to  
22 Pay Level II of Grade 16, after the following criteria has been met: the  
23 incumbent Correctional Officer I must have completed at least six (6) months  
24 continuous service as a Correctional Officer I; and the incumbent must have  
25 completed a minimum of two hundred (200) hours Correctional Officer training;  
26 and the incumbent must have passed a six (6) months evaluation.

27  
28 SECTION 23. MEDICAL SERVICES. If it has been found that the Department  
29 cannot continue a medical contract with a private provider and the Board deems  
30 it necessary to utilize Department staff to provide the required services, the  
31 Department is allowed, upon notification of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the  
32 State and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council, to  
33 utilize the contingent positions contained in Section 1 of this Act and make  
34 the appropriate transfers from Professional Fees and Services character  
35 contained in Section 3 of this Act to Regular Salaries, Personal Services

1 Matching and various Maintenance and General Operations classifications.

2

3 SECTION 24. In the event the Department of Correction cannot accept  
4 inmates from county jails due to insufficient bed space, the Department shall  
5 reimburse the counties at a rate determined by the Board of Correction until  
6 the appropriation provided for such purpose is exhausted. The prevailing rate  
7 of the county jail will be considered by the Board in determining the rate to  
8 be reimbursed. The appropriation provided by Item (08) of Section 3 may also  
9 be used for contracts with county jails for pre-release inmates.

10

11 SECTION 25. In the event of a substantial increase in utility rates,  
12 the Department of Correction is authorized to transfer any line item  
13 appropriation in this Act to the Maintenance and Operation line item for  
14 support of the increase after receiving approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer  
15 of the State.

16

17 SECTION 26. TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATION WITHIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT  
18 PROJECTS. The Department of Correction is hereby authorized to transfer  
19 appropriation between and/or among the various capital  
20 improvements/construction projects authorized by the General Assembly. Such  
21 transfers may be made only after approval by the Governor. Such authorization  
22 shall in no way mean that the total amount of funds or appropriations for  
23 capital improvement/construction projects be greater than that provided by the  
24 General Assembly for the Department of Correction.

25

26 SECTION 27. MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES. In the event the Department  
27 determines to enter into a professional contract for mental health services,  
28 the Department may, upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and  
29 after prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council, make appropriate  
30 transfers from regular salaries, personal services matching and various  
31 maintenance and operation classifications to the professional fees and  
32 services classification for payment of the contractual amount.

33

34 SECTION 28. The Department of Correction is authorized to transfer  
35 funds from various Special Revenue and Cash Funds into the Inmate Care and

1 Custody Fund Account in order to adjust to the budget needs upon approval of  
2 the Board of Correction and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

3

4 SECTION 29. NEW FACILITIES. If it is found that contracting for the  
5 operation of new facilities is economically beneficial to the State of  
6 Arkansas, the Department of Correction may, after receiving approval of the  
7 Chief Fiscal Officer, and seeking prior review by the Arkansas Legislative  
8 Council, transfer from any line item appropriation contained in Section 3 of  
9 this Act into the Professional Fees and Services character contained in  
10 Section 3 of this Act to operate new facilities opened during the biennium.

11

12 SECTION 30. Receipts from cities or counties reimbursed to the  
13 Department for daily care of city or county prisoners shall be accounted for  
14 separately. The debt service of such receipts shall be used for payment of  
15 debt service on bonds, loans or any other instruments used to finance regional  
16 jail facilities. The operational portion of such receipts shall also be used  
17 for debt service unless approval is received from the Director of the  
18 Department of Finance and Administration for other usages.

19

20 SECTION 31. The Department of Correction is hereby authorized to  
21 transfer appropriations between any line items authorized herein but only for  
22 the purpose of financing construction or equipment for a facility of the  
23 department. Any transfers authorized by this section shall require the  
24 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State after prior review by the  
25 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

26

27 SECTION 32. The Department of Correction may report to the Joint  
28 Interim Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs no later than  
29 December 1 of each year regarding its efforts in rehabilitating the inmate  
30 population. Such report may include the Department's rehabilitative efforts  
31 regarding inmate education, specific job training, behavior modification,  
32 psychological treatment and assistance, and substance abuse programs.  
33 Further, the report is to include the amount of meritorious good time awarded  
34 inmates by the Department for the successful completion of the various  
35 rehabilitative programs.

1

2           SECTION 33. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
3 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
4 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
5 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and  
6 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
7 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control  
8 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the  
9 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
10 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

11

12           SECTION 34. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
13 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
14 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which  
15 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
16 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
17 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
18 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
19 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

20

21           SECTION 35. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and  
22 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the  
23 Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

24

25           SECTION 36. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the  
26 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such  
27 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which  
28 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this  
29 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

30

31           SECTION 37. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict  
32 with this Act are hereby repealed.

33

34           SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the  
35 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas

1 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that  
2 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1993 is essential to the operation of  
3 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
4 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
5 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1993 could work irreparable harm upon the  
6 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
7 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
8 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
9 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1993.
