(a) The Director of the General Education Division of the 23 24 Arkansas Department of Education shall develop the materials or units for the 25 teaching of historical contributions by African-Americans in the United States 26 of America and other countries prior to the establishment of the United States 27 for inclusion in the appropriate curricula of all kindergarten through twelfth 28 grades of all public schools in the State of Arkansas beginning with the 1994-29 95 school year. 3 0 The Director shall insure that these materials or units are 31 reproduced and sent to all school districts in the state. 32 33 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 34 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 35 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
