ACT 1145 OF 1995
HOUSE BILL 2129

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE SMALL CITY STREET DEVELOPMENT
9 FUND; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

Subtitle

12 "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE SMALL CITY
13 STREET DEVELOPMENT FUND."

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

17 SECTION 1. This act may be cited as the "Small City Street Fund Act."

19 SECTION 2. The General Assembly finds that the majority of street and
20 road improvement funds are made available to larger cities throughout the
21 state. Small cities have to look to other sources to seek funds to improve
22 city streets. In most instances, the cities are unsuccessful and roads remain
23 unpaved which hinders the cities ability to attract business and industry.

25 SECTION 3. There is established on the books of the State Treasurer,
26 State Auditor and Chief Fiscal Officer of this state the Small City Street
27 Fund to be comprised of funds appropriated by the General Assembly to be made
28 available to small cities throughout the state to be used to improve streets.
29 The funds shall be administered by the Arkansas Development Finance
30 Authority. *The term "small cities" as used in this act means all first and*
31 *second class cities and incorporated towns in Arkansas with populations of*
32 *less than five*
33 *thousand (5,000) persons, according to the latest federal decennial census.*

34 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
35 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
36 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
