**ACT 320 OF 1995**  
**SENATE BILL 335**

## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND  
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE MISSISSIPPI COUNTY COMMUNITY  
10 COLLEGE FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1997; AND  
11 FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE MISSISSIPPI COUNTY  
15 COMMUNITY COLLEGE APPROPRIATION FOR THE  
16 1995-97 BIENNIUM."

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

20 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the  
21 Mississippi County Community College for the 1995-97 biennium, the following  
22 maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the  
23 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code  
24 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.  
25 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary  
26 is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said  
27 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions  
28 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular  
29 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its  
30 successor.

23 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the  
 24 Mississippi County Community College for the 1995-97 biennium, the following  
 25 maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra  
 26 Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: four hundred  
 27 (400) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to  
 28 exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or  
 29 its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

30  
 31 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS - GENERAL REVENUE. There is hereby  
 32 appropriated, to the Mississippi County Community College, to be payable from  
 33 the Mississippi County Community College Fund, for personal services and  
 34 operating expenses of the Mississippi County Community College for the  
 35 biennial period ending June 30, 1997, the following:

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Mississippi County Community College, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Mississippi County Community College, ~~for personal services and operating expenses of the Mississippi County~~ Community College for the biennial period ending June 30, 1997, the following:

10 SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

11 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

12 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

13 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and

14 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

15 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions

16 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where

17 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and

18 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in

19 disbursement of said funds.

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21 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General

22 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations

23 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which

24 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

25 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

26 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or

27 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative

28 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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30 SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent

31 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas

32 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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34 SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the

35 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such

1 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which  
2 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this  
3 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

5 SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict  
6 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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8 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the  
9 Eightieth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas  
10 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that  
11 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1995 is essential to the operation of  
12 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
13 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
14 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1995 could work irreparable harm upon the  
15 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
16 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
17 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
18 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1995.
