         The commission in applying the formula shall determine that funding the

13 project will result in economic activity within the state that provides a
14 revenue-neutral or revenue-positive impact on the state's current general
15 revenues.
              The Executive Director of the Arkansas Industrial Development
17 Commission shall enter into an agreement with each successful applicant that
18 shall include the specific terms and conditions of the financial assistance to
19 be provided. These terms shall include a take-back provision in the event
20 the applicant fails to meet the terms of the agreement. Any legal recourse
21 set out by these provisions shall be pursued by the Chief Fiscal Officer of
22 the State.

         (d) Any applicant receiving assistance from the fund shall be liable to
24 repay any assistance received if it does not comply with the terms of any
25 disbursement agreement, the criteria set out in this act, and any rule or
26 regulation promulgated by the Chief Fiscal Officer with regard to the Arkansas
27 Aviation and Aerospace Industry Development Fund. The repayment shall be made
28 to the Chief Fiscal Officer and credited to the fund. The Chief Fiscal
29 Officer may bring any lawful action to recover any amount for which the
30 recipient is liable."
