- 12 provides services without any financial gain to any local school district.

1 (2) Take actions as are necessary to ensure that qualified volunteers have written job descriptions that define their duties and responsibilities; 4 (3) Provide for the recognition of qualified volunteers who have offered exceptional service to the district; and 6 (4) Provide support for the volunteer program established under å 21-13-101 et seq. 8 REGISTERED VOLUNTEERS - REQUIREMENTS. 9 SECTION 5. 10 The superintendent of any school district that develops a registered volunteers program as set forth in this Act shall require all potential registered volunteers to meet the following qualifications before the volunteers have any significant unsupervised contact with students: (1) To authorize release of the results of a state and nationwide 14 15 criminal records check by the Identification Bureau of the Department of 16 Arkansas State Police, which conforms to the applicable federal standards, includes the taking of the potential volunteer's fingerprints, and is dated not more than ninety (90) days prior to the date of its presentation; 19 (2)(A) To present a certificate of health dated not more than ninety (90) days prior to the date of its presentation stating that the potential 2.0 volunteer is free from tuberculosis; 22 (B) Such certificate may be issued by a regularly licensed 23 physician or regularly constituted health authority, but interpretation of any X-ray film must be made by a competent roentgenologist or physician 2.5 experienced in tuberculosis; 26 (3) To complete a minimum of six (6) hours of training conducted under 27 the direction of the district for nonathletic extracurricular or nonathletic interscholastic activities and a minimum of twelve (12) hours of training 29 conducted under the direction of the district for athletic extracurricular activities or under the direction of the Arkansas Activites Association for 31 athletic interscholastic activities. 32 33 SECTION 6.          (a) The Department of Education is authorized and directed to establish
 7 a self-insurance fund or to negotiate for and procure a group or blanket
 8 policy or policies of insurance, or both, insuring school board members,
 9 school nurses, school secretaries, substitute teachers, authorized volunteers,
10 volunteers in a registered volunteers program, school custodians, food service
11 workers employed by public schools, bus drivers and mechanics employed by
12 public schools, maintenance personnel employed by public schools, each
13 employee of a public school district and each employee of the Arkansas School
14 for the Deaf and the Arkansas School for the Blind who is required to hold a
15 teaching certificate issued by the Department of Education, each teacher's
16 aide and each student teacher in a public school district or in the Arkansas
17 School for the Deaf or the Arkansas School for the Blind, and each member of

The provisions of this act shall apply to those schools and institutions that voluntarily join the Arkansas Activities Association. 3 (c) None of the provisions of this act shall be construed as to prohibit a school district from utilizing the services of the volunteers who operate under the supervision of certified school personnel. 6 7 SECTION 9. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 8 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 9 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 10 11 SECTION 10. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 12 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 13 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 14 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 15 act are declared to be severable. 16 17 SECTION 11. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 18 hereby repealed. 19 EMERGENCY. It is found and determined by the General 20 SECTION 12. 21 Assembly that the immediate passage of this Act is necessary for the 22 establishment of a registered volunteers program whereby local school 23 districts can utilize the services of qualified volunteers in certain extracurricular and interscholastic activities and that any delay will cause 25 irreparable harm to those students who will be unable to participate in 26 extracurricular and interscholastic activities during the current school year 27 and each year thereafter because school districts cannot afford to pay 28 certified teachers to sponsor the activities or there are no certified 29 teachers available to act as sponsors. Therefore, an emergency is declared to 30 exist and this Act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the 31 public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on the date of its 32 approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the 33 Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time 34 during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the 35 Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the
