19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
22 Henderson State University for the 1997-99 biennium, the following maximum
23 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions
24 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201
25 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,
26 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set
27 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
28 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
29 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
30 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
31 successor.

SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Henderson State University for the 1997-99 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",

1 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: nine hundred fifty
 2 (950) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to
 3 exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or
 4 its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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6 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS - GENERAL REVENUE. There is hereby
 7 appropriated, to the Henderson State University, to be payable from the
 8 ~~Henderson State University Fund, for personal services and operating expenses~~
 9 of the Henderson State University for the biennial period ending June 30,
 10 1999, the following:

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30 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,
 31 to the Henderson State University, to be payable from cash funds as defined by
 32 Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Henderson State University, for personal
 33 services and operating expenses of the Henderson State University for the
 34 biennial period ending June 30, 1999, the following:

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19 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - FOOD SERVICE. If Henderson State
 20 University cancels the current contract for food service and chooses to
 21 operate the food service with University employees, the President, upon
 22 authorization of the Board of Trustees, is allowed to utilize the contingent
 23 positions contained in Section 1 of this Act, provided he or she has obtained
 24 approval from the Department of Higher Education and the Chief Fiscal Officer
 25 of the State, who has sought prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council.

26 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - SPECIAL ALLOWANCE. The Board of Trustees
 27 of Henderson State University may make special allowances available to any
 28 coach who coaches more than one sport in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 per
 29 year for any one coach during each year of the 1997-99 biennium.

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31 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Board of Trustees
 32 ~~of Henderson State University may approve a housing allowance up to six~~
 33 hundred fifty dollars (\$650) per month for the President of the University.
 34 Such allowance shall be in lieu of any state-owned housing provided for the
 35 President.

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2 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - None of the positions authorized or
3 funds appropriated herein shall be used for the support of the Science
4 Information Liaison Office (SILO) program, or its successor program or
5 programs. All assets and funds allocated to the SILO Program shall be
6 transferred to the Bureau of Legislative Research, to be used for research and
7 constituency services for the 135 members of the Arkansas General Assembly.

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9 SECTION 9. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
10 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
11 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
12 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
13 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
14 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions
15 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where
16 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
17 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
18 disbursement of said funds.

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20 SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
21 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
22 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
23 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
24 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
25 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
26 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
27 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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29 SECTION 11. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
30 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and
31 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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33 SECTION 12. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
34 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
35 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which

1 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
2 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

3

4 SECTION 13. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
5 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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7 SECTION 14. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
8 Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
9 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
10 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the operation of
11 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm upon the
14 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1997.
