19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the South
22 Arkansas Community College for the 1997-99 biennium, the following maximum
23 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions
24 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201
25 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,
26 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set
27 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
28 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
29 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
30 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
31 successor.

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12 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the South
 13 Arkansas Community College for the 1997-99 biennium, the following maximum
 14 number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",
 15 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one hundred seventy
 16 five (175) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not
 17 to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act,
 18 or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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20 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the South
 21 Arkansas Community College, to be payable from the South Arkansas Community
 22 College Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the South
 23 Arkansas Community College for the biennial period ending June 30, 1999, the
 24 following:

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 6 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,
 7 to the South Arkansas Community College, to be payable from cash funds as
 8 defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the South Arkansas Community College, for
 9 personal services and operating expenses of the South Arkansas Community
 10 College for the biennial period ending June 30, 1999, the following:

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 31 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - PRIORITIES. A high priority of South
 32 Arkansas Community College shall be to combat illiteracy and to provide
 33 industrial training in the work place.

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 35 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The appropriation level provided in

1 Section 3 of this Act shall not be construed as a commitment of the Arkansas
2 General Assembly to provide a particular level of support from the Work Force
3 2000 Development Fund for the South Arkansas Community College but rather that
4 the funds to be made available are to be based upon legitimate criteria and
5 accreditation requirements as determined by the State Board of Higher
6 Education for all technical colleges.

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8 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
9 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
10 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
11 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
12 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
13 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions
14 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where
15 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and
16 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in
17 disbursement of said funds.

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19 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
20 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
21 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
22 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
23 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
24 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
25 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
26 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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28 SECTION 9. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
29 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
30 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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32 SECTION 10. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
33 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
34 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
35 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this

1 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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3 SECTION 11. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
4 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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6 SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
7 Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
8 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
9 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the operation of
10 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
11 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
12 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm upon the
13 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
14 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
15 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
16 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1997.
