18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
19

20 SECTION 1. (a) A person holding more than one (1) elective office shall
21 be entitled to receive compensation from only one (1) of the offices held.
22 The person shall select the office from which he or she may receive
23 compensation. The person shall select the office by filing a statement with
24 the Secretary of State and the disbursing officer of each governmental entity
25 in which he or she holds an elective officer.

26 (b) For the purpose of this section:

27 (1) "Compensation" means all salaries, retirement allowances,
28 group insurance, medical benefits, and anything else of value that a
29 governmental entity provides in return for the services of its officers.

30 (2) "Elective office" means any office created by or under
31 authority of the laws of the State of Arkansas, or of a subdivision thereof,
32 that is filled by the voters, except a federal office.
33

34 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
35 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
36 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
