10 AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE ARKANSAS STATE
11 UNIVERSITY - MOUNTAIN HOME FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD
12 ENDING JUNE 30, 2001; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

14 "AN ACT FOR THE ARKANSAS STATE
15 UNIVERSITY - MOUNTAIN HOME APPROPRIATION
16 FOR THE 1999-2001 BIENNIUM."
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
23 the Arkansas State University - Mountain Home for the 1999-2001 biennium, the
24 following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed
25 by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas
26 Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
27 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary
28 is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said
29 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
30 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
31 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
32 successor.

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11 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the
 12 Arkansas State University - Mountain Home for the 1999-2001 biennium, the
 13 following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as
 14 "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: fifty
 15 (50) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to
 16 exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or
 17 its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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19 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 20 to the Arkansas State University - Mountain Home, to be payable from the
 21 Arkansas State University - Mountain Home Fund, for personal services and
 22 operating expenses of the Arkansas State University - Mountain Home for the
 23 biennial period ending June 30, 2001, the following:

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas State University - Mountain Home, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Arkansas State University - Mountain Home, for personal services and operating expenses of the Arkansas State University - Mountain Home for the biennial period ending June 30, 2001, the following:

SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PRIORITIES. A high priority of the Arkansas State University - Mountain Home shall be to combat illiteracy and to provide industrial training in the work place.

SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and

1 Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their
 2 successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and
 3 regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as
 4 authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said
 5 funds.

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 7 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 8 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 9 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
 10 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
 11 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
 12 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
 13 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
 14 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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 16 SECTION 8. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
 17 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
 18 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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 20 SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act or the application
 21 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall
 22 not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given
 23 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
 24 provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

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 26 SECTION 10. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with
 27 this act are hereby repealed.

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 29 SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
 30 Eighty-second General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
 31 prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
 32 the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1999 is essential to the operation of
 33 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
 34 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
 35 date of this Act beyond July 1, 1999 could work irreparable harm upon the
 36 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.

1 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
2 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
3 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1999.
