1	SECTION 2. The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized
2	to promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of the
3	career ladder incentive program and shall report the rules and regulations to
4	the Arkansas Legislative Council no later than December 31, 1999. For
5	purposes of establishing such rules and regulations, the Governor shall
6	appoint a Career Ladder Incentive Program Task Force, representative of all
7	boards, commissions, state agencies and institutions of higher education to
8	provide technical assistance to the Office of Personnel Management. Following
9	approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council, the Department of Finance and
10	Administration may begin a phased implementation of the program during the
11	remainder of the 1999-2001 biennium. All reclassification of positions
12	related to the implementation of the career ladder incentive program by any
13	agency, board, commission, or institution of higher education must be approved
14	by the Office of Personnel Management after receiving prior approval of the
15	Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. The Office of
16	Personnel Management shall report at least quarterly during the biennium
17	regarding its progress and agency institution involvement in the career ladder
18	incentive program. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or
19	Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the
20	requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
21	is ruled unconstitutional by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is
22	<u>voi d.</u>
23	
24	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
25	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
26	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
27	
28	SECTION 4. Except as provided in Section 2 herein, if any provision of
29	this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
30	invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of
31	the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or
32	application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be
33	severable.

SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are

2	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
3	Eighty-second General Assembly that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
4	requires the General Assembly to develop a career ladder incentive program
5	which will allow for the development of a competency based pay program for
6	employees of state agencies and institutions of higher education. Therefore,
7	an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for
8	the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective
9	on July 1, 1999.
