## Subtitle

14 "AN ACT FOR THE MARTIN LUTHER KING,  
15 JR. COMMISSION APPROPRIATION FOR  
16 THE 1999-2001 BIENNIUM."  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the Martin  
23 Luther King, Jr. Commission for the 1999-2001 biennium, the following maximum  
24 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions  
25 of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201  
26 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided,  
27 however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set  
28 out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform  
29 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions  
30 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular  
31 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its  
32 successor.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commission, to be payable from the State General Services Fund Account, for personal services and operating expenses of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commission for the biennial period ending June 30, 2001, the following:

SECTION 3. EXTRA HELP - CASH. There is hereby authorized, for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commission for the 1999-2001 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: four (4) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH. There is hereby appropriated, to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commission, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commission, for personal services and operating expenses of the Martin Luther King, Jr.

Commission for the biennial period ending June 30, 2001, the following:

SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Eighty-second General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1999 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1999 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1999.
