Arkansas Code 24-5-125 is hereby amended to read as follows: 24 *"* 24-5-125. Eligibility to receive increase in benefits. 25 (a) In order to help offset the costs of health insurance and health 26 27 care, Any any individual who is receiving benefits from the Arkansas State 28 Highway Employees' Retirement System prior to, on, or subsequent to, July 1, 29 1991 1999, shall have added to his or her annuity as determined pursuant to § 24-5-115 no less than the sum of fifty one hundred twenty-five dollars 30 (\$50.00) (\$125) per month, provided, the board may elect and is granted the 31 32 authority to increase that additional monthly sum to all such individuals in an amount determined by the board as necessary to help offset the ever 33 escalating costs of health insurance and health care, provided; further, such 34 35 additional monthly sum shall not exceed two hundred-fifty dollars (\$250) per No benefit enhancement provided by this section shall be implemented 36 month.

- (b)(1) If an individual is also receiving benefits as a result of credited service under one (1) or more of the other reciprocal systems, as such systems as enumerated in \S 24-2-401, that individual shall receive a prorata portion of the amount set forth in subsection (a) of this section from the system.
- (2) That pro rata portion shall be determined by dividing the years of creditable service with the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department by the member's or deceased member's total years of creditable service with all reciprocal systems, provided the individual receiving such benefits shall receive the additional amounts set out in subsection (a) of this section in total from such systems if the member or deceased member was employed at least five (5) years in each of the reciprocal systems.

 (c) The increase in benefits as provided in this section shall be added to the base annuity for the purpose of computing the annual postretirement increase as provided in § 24-5-119(a) for the benefit redetermination for the

year beginning July 1, 1991, and ending June 30, 1992, and for all years

thereafter."

SECTION 2. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall be implemented if it would cause the publicly supported retirement system's unfunded actuarial accrued liabilities to exceed a thirty (30) year amortization. No benefit enhancement provided for by this act shall be implemented by any publicly supported system which has unfunded actuarial accrued liabilities being amortized over a period exceeding thirty (30) years until the unfunded actuarial accrued liability is reduced to a level less than the standards prescribed by Arkansas Code, Title 24."

SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without

1	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
2	act are declared to be severable.

4	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
5	hereby repealed.
6	
7	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
8	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that, due to the ever escalating costs of
9	health insurance and health care, benefits provided under the Arkansas State
10	Highway Employees' Retirement System are inadequate and that an increase
11	should be provided as soon as practicable in order to avoid an undue hardship.
12	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act being
13	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, shall
14	be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 1999.
