9 AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 6-43-317 CONCERNING THE
10 SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF; TO PROVIDE THAT THE
11 SUPERINTENDENT AND OTHER SCHOOL OFFICIALS MAY BE
12 REQUIRED TO RESIDE AT THE INSTITUTION; TO AUTHORIZE
13 ADDITIONAL BENEFITS TO THE SUPERINTENDENT; AND FOR
14 OTHER PURPOSES.

25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

27 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-43-317 is amended to read as follows:
28 6-43-317. Boarding and lodging.

29 (a) It shall be the duty of the principal to furnish, or cause to be
30 furnished, suitable and proper boarding and lodging, as well as suitable
31 instruction, for all hearing impaired persons received as beneficiaries. He
32 shall receive into the school other hearing impaired persons according to
33 such regulations as the trustees may prescribe.

34 (b)(1) ~~The principal and matron shall constantly~~ Board of Trustees of
35 the Arkansas School for the Blind and the Arkansas School for the Deaf may
36 require the superintendent or other school official to reside in at the

1 institution, ~~but the assistant teachers and other officers may occupy other~~
2 ~~buildings, to be provided at their own expense.~~

3 (2) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas School for the Blind
4 and the Arkansas School for the Deaf may provide other benefits to the
5 superintendent out of the operation funds of the respective school.

6 (c) No person shall lodge or board in the school who is not a pupil
7 thereof, except its officers and their families.
