SECTION 1. The General Assembly finds:
(1) That knowledge of the state's economy plays a central role in the |egislative process;
(2) That the members of the General Assembly require a comprehensive understanding of the present health and the potential for economic growth of
this state in order to effectively represent the people;
(3) That the members of the General Assembly require a comprehensive understanding of the economic position of this state in relation to our neighbor states in order to effectively represent the people; and
(4) That understanding the state of the state's economy requires that the members of the General Assembly receive regular, comprenensive reports of

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the programs, goals and strategies of the Department of Economic Development.
    SECTION 2. Beginning with the May, 2002, meeting of the Legislative
Council, and annually thereafter, the Director of the Department of Economic
Development shal| present a report on the department's work during the
previous calendar year, in these areas of concern:
    (1) An accounting of all projects completed the previous cal endar year,
including:
            (A) The number of jobs created by each project and average hourly
wages or annual salaries for each project;
            (B) The location of each project; and
            (C) What elements of our incentive packages were used;
    (2) An accounting of all project offered but not opened, including:
            (A) An assessment of the reasons why of fered projects failed to
