9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PURCHASING DATA
10 PROCESSING EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES FOR THE DEPARTMENT
11 OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION - MANAGEMENT SERVICES
12 DIVISION WHICH SHALL BE SUPPLEMENTAL AND IN ADDITION
13 TO THOSE FUNDS APPROPRIATED BY ACT 1428 OF 1999; AND
14 FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

16 AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND
17 ADMINISTRATION - MANAGEMENT SERVICES
18 DIVISION - PURCHASING DATA PROCESSING
19 EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES SUPPLEMENTAL
20 APPROPRIATION.
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25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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27 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - MARKETING AND REDISTRIBUTION. There is hereby
28 appropriated, to the Department of Finance and Administration - Management
29 Services Division, to be payable from the Property Sales Holding Fund, for
30 purchasing data processing equipment and services to implement mobile data
31 gathering/bar coding and web page enabled cataloging and auctioning
32 capabilities of the Department of Finance and Administration - Management
33 Services Division - Marketing and Redistribution which shall be supplemental
34 and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 14 of Act 1428 of 1999,
35 the following:

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5 SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by
6 this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made
7 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions
8 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures
9 Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and
10 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
11 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
12 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
13 with in disbursement of said funds.

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15 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
16 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
17 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
18 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
19 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
20 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
21 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
22 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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24 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
25 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of
26 the Department of Finance and Administration - Management Services Division
27 are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient for the Department of
28 Finance and Administration - Management Services Division to continue to
29 provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will
30 provide the necessary monies for the Department of Finance and Administration
31 - Management Services Division to continue such services; and that a delay in
32 the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper
33 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an
34 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
35 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full
36 force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. If the

1 bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective
2 on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
3 bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it
4 shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
