20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21

22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
23 Department of Health for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number
24 of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of
25 the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et
26 seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,
27 that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein
28 in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
29 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
30 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
31 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
32 successor.

 14 not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation
 15 Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

17 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 18 to the Department of Health, to be payable from the Public Health Fund, for
 19 personal services and operating expenses of the Department of Health - State

29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
30 INTERPRETERS. Any employee who is fluent in a second language and uses that
31 language as a part of their routine job responsibilities shall be eligible
32 for up to ten percent (10%) of additional compensation within the grade
33 during the period of time in which said employee occupies the position
34 performs those responsibilities. Employees on the highest level of their
35 grade may be eligible for additional compensation in an amount not to exceed
36 five and one half percent (5.5%) of their current salary upon assuming

1 responsibility, and this amount shall not be construed as exceeding the line
2 item maximum for the grade for that position. The Health Department shall
3 certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer the assignment of duties of each employee
4 in this position role, the length of such assignment, and the location and
5 reason for the assignment. The agency must secure approval of the Chief
6 Fiscal Officer prior to awarding such additional compensation. The Department
7 of Health shall report monthly to the Legislative Council all such payments
8 made under this provision.

9
10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001
11 through June 30, 2003.

12
13 SECTION 57. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
14 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For all
15 appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall
16 monitor the level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly
17 basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to
18 less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001, the
19 disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the agency.
20 Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency
21 head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
22 State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
23 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
24 include the following:

- 25 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
26 expenditures on the fund balance.
27 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut
28 or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
29 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
30 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
31 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
32 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
33 depletion of the fund balance.

34 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
35 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
36 prior review by the Legislative Council.

1
2 SECTION 58. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
3 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
4 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
5 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
6 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
7 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
8 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
9 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
10 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

11
12 SECTION 59. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
13 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
14 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
15 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
16 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
17 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
18 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
19 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

20
21 SECTION 60. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
22 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
23 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
24 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of
25 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
26 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
27 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the
28 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
29 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
30 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
31 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2001.
