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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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26 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - ERNEST HEMINGWAY PFEIFFER MUSEUM AND EDUCATIONAL
27 CENTER. There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas State University, to be
28 payable from the State General Services Fund Account, for personal services
29 and maintenance and operations of the Ernest Hemingway Pfeiffer Museum and
30 Educational Center of the Arkansas State University which shall be
31 supplemental and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 1 of Act
32 544 of 1999, the following:

SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL OR TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer the sum of sixty-eight thousand six-hundred sixty-three dollars (\$68,663) from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the State General Services Fund Account to provide funds for the appropriation provided herein.

SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of the Arkansas State University are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient for the Arkansas State University to continue to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies for the Arkansas State University to continue such

1 services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Act could work
2 irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential
3 governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and
4 this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
5 health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of
6 its passage and approval.

7 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
8 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
9 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
10 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the
11 veto.
