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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-63-305(b), concerning new or
22 additional positions for institutions of higher education, is amended to read
23 as follows:

24 (b) The following maximum number of new additional positions is established
25 for the biennium for the following institutions of higher education at salary
26 rates not to exceed the salary rate of comparable positions established in the
27 regular salaries section of the biennial appropriations act for operations for

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 19-4-906(a), Item Number (066), establishing the maximum authorized number of passenger motor vehicles, is amended to read as follows:

(066) Garland County Community College 7 9

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that various changes in law are needed for the institutions of higher education including the authorization of additional positions due to additional funds received other than general revenue for various programs and additional vehicles to maintain efficient operations of campuses. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2001.
