SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the State Forestry Commission for the 2003-2005 biennium, the following maximum number of parttime or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: ninety (90) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

13 SECTION 6. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES - STATE 14 15 FORESTRY TRUST FUND. (A) For all appropriations as provided in this Act, 16 the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level of fund balances in 17 relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause the State Forestry Trust Fund to decline below five hundred 18 thirty-one thousand twenty two dollars (\$531,022) a fund balance to decline 19 to less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001, 20 21 the disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the 22 agency. Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the 23 agency head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of 24 the State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall 25 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall 26 include the following:

27 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such28 expenditures on the fund balance.

2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut
or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
or one-time purchase of capitalized items.

4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
depletion of the fund balance.

36 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and

1 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought 2 prior review by the Legislative Council.

6 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 7 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 8 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 9 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 10 11 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 12 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 13 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 14 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

16 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 17 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 18 19 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 20 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 21 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 22 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 23 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

25 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 26 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 27 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 28 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 29 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 30 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the 31 32 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 33 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 34 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 35 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
