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
19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 26-77-101 is repealed.

23 ~~In fixing the amount of penalty for the violation of any of the~~  
24 ~~provisions of this chapter, the city council, board of commissioners, or the~~  
25 ~~board of aldermen of any city or town shall not have the right to place the~~  
26 ~~amount for the penalty in excess of double the amount of the license fee~~  
27 ~~provided, together with the costs necessary for the collection of it.~~  
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29 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
30 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that § 26-77-101 inhibits the  
31 ability of local governments to enforce laws requiring business licenses; and  
32 that this act is immediately necessary because business licenses play an  
33 important role in allowing local governments to enforce zoning and other  
34 local regulations. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act  
35 being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,  
36 and safety shall become effective on:



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(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
