9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE  
10 MILITARY DEPARTMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION, ADDITIONS,  
11 MODIFICATIONS, AND REHABILITATION AT VARIOUS  
12 NATIONAL GUARD FACILITIES; AND FOR OTHER  
13 PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

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16 AN ACT FOR THE STATE MILITARY DEPARTMENT  
17 - NATIONAL GUARD FACILITIES  
18 CONSTRUCTION, ADDITIONS, MODIFICATIONS  
19 AND REHABILITATION GENERAL IMPROVEMENT  
20 APPROPRIATION.  
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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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26 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT FUND. There is hereby  
27 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the  
28 General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, the  
29 following:

30 (A) For Phase III of major repair and rehabilitation of all armories  
31 throughout the state, the sum of .....\$2,000,000.

32 (B) For an 89 person readiness center of permanent construction for the  
33 Warren Armory, the sum of .....\$1,075,575.

34 (C) For alterations to existing buildings to meet ADA regulations  
35 including ramps, restroom alterations, passageway alterations and parking  
36 spaces, the sum of .....\$174,800.



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SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS - FEDERAL FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the federal funds as designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the following:

(A) For building an Army Aviation Support Facility with a hanger and administrative space, the sum of .....\$35,256,300.

(B) For construction of a permanent masonry addition for the Weapons of Mass Destruction Unit plus alterations to the existing facility, the sum of .....\$1,711,800.

(C) For construction of a new Ammunition Supply Point at Fort Chaffee Maneuver Training Center for ammunition storage, handling, shipment and administration, the sum of .....\$14,376,300.

(D) For an 89 person readiness center of permanent construction for the Warren Armory, the sum of .....\$3,226,725.

(E) For construction of an access control booth and electrically powered gates for traffic control/access to the main entrance at Camp Robinson, the sum of .....\$14,376,300.

(F) For construction of a new Ammunition Supply Point at Camp Robinson for ammunition storage, handling, shipment and administration, the sum of .....\$3,536,300.

(G) For construction of an access control booth and electrically powered gates for traffic control/access to the main entrance at the Fort Chaffee Maneuver Training Center, the sum of .....\$1,952,500.

(H) For construction of a "contonement" or "central facility" area fence for the training area at Camp Robinson to meet current anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, the sum of .....\$3,663,000.

(I) For construction of a "contonement" or "central facility" area fence for the training area at Fort Chaffee Maneuver Training Center to meet current anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, the sum of .\$.3,663,000.

(J) For construction of an additional thirty-five (35) miles of fencing for the training area at Camp Robinson to meet current anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, the sum of .....\$3,663,000.

SECTION 3. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available

1 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and  
 2 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and  
 3 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or  
 4 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State  
 5 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects  
 6 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds  
 7 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General  
 8 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall  
 9 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

10 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing  
 11 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue  
 12 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State  
 13 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,  
 14 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any  
 15 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

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 17 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
 18 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
 19 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
 20 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
 21 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
 22 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
 23 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
 24 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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 26 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
 27 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
 28 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the  
 29 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of  
 30 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
 31 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
 32 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the  
 33 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
 34 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
 35 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
 36 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
