34	fire bosses and mine foremen, is amended to read as follows:			
35	(a) <u>(1)</u> The board <u>Director of the Department of Labor</u> shall grant			
36	certificates after examination to all applicants who have shown themselves			



familiar with the duties of the position for which they desire certificates and are capable of performing such duties by the Arkansas Department of Labor or a determination by the department that the testing requirements have been satisfied in another jurisdiction. (2) The certificates shall be granted to all applicants who through these testing procedures have shown themselves familiar with the duties of the position for which they desire certificates and are capable of performing such duties. (1)(3) Certificates of the first grade shall be granted only to applicants who, by oral or written examinations in the presence of and relating to explosive gas, have shown themselves competent to act as mine foremen in mines which generate explosive and noxious gases, and the certificate shall so state. (2)(4) Certificates for mine inspector and assistant mine inspector shall be granted only to applicants who have shown themselves duly qualified, as provided by the law creating the office, and no appointments shall be made to these offices unless the appointee shall hold a certificate.
