3 (a) There is established the Office of Arkansas State Arts and
4 Humanities Arkansas Arts Council as a separate and distinct office agency
5 under the laws of the State of Arkansas and under the jurisdiction and
6 supervision of the Department of Arkansas Heritage.

7 (b) The office agency shall consist of an advisory council and an 8 executive director. (d) The office agency shall be the sole and official agency of this state authorized to accept and receive, in addition to federal grants, any money and real and personal property donated, bequeathed, or devised for any purpose relating to the development and expansion of the arts and humanities and not expressly designated for some other state agency and to disburse and utilize those gifts for the purposes of this subchapter.

30 (e) The office agency is authorized to establish and collect 31 reasonable fees for, but not limited to, advertising in newsletters and 32 requested mailing list labels. The fees collected shall be deposited in a 33 financial institution in this state and shall be used to support services 34 that conform to the purposes of this subchapter.

35 (f) The office agency shall submit an annual report to the Governor as 36 of June 30 of each year, summarizing the office's agency's activities,
