6	to protect counties conducting reappraisals; and that this act is immediately
7	necessary because delaying implementation would cause irreparable delays in
8	the proper assessments for property. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
9	exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
10	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
11	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
12	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
13	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
14	bill; or
15	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
16	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
