19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 21-6-403(b), as amended by Act 431 of 2005,
22 is amended to read as follows:

23 (b) The uniform filing fees shall be:

24 (1) For initiating a cause of action in the circuit court,
25 including appeals\$140.00

26 (2) For reopening a cause of action in the circuit court
27~~30.00~~ 50.00

28 (3) For any cause of action which by court order is transferred
29 from any district or circuit court to a circuit court50.00.

31 SECTION 2. Title 19, Chapter 6, Subchapter 4 is amended to add a new
32 section as follows:

33 19-6-499. Public Legal Aid Fund.

34 (a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor
35 of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special revenue fund to be



1 known as the "Public Legal Aid Fund".

2 (b) The fund shall consist of such revenues as may be authorized by
3 law.

4 (c) The fund shall be used for providing financial support for public
5 legal aid organizations and distributed as follows:

6 (1) Forty-five percent (45%) of the fund shall be paid to Legal
7 Aid of Arkansas; and

8 (2) Fifty-five percent (55%) of the fund shall be paid to the
9 Center for Arkansas Legal Services.
