21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
24 the Arkansas State University for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following
25 maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the
26 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code
27 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
28 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual
29 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of
30 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying
31 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the
32 Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101),
33 or its successor.

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES. Upon determination by the President of Arkansas State University that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or consolidation of administrative functions within the university is necessary for efficient and effective operations of the university, the president, with approval of the Arkansas State University Board of Trustees, may have the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of Arkansas State University. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General Assembly. The transfers, consolidation, or reorganization which involve academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education and receive prior approval from the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that Arkansas State University may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to Arkansas State University authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is

1 void.

2 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
3 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

5 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LEASES.
7 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Board of Trustees of Arkansas
8 State University may hereafter lease facilities for operations for room and
9 board purposes in any manner and upon terms the board deems to be in the best
10 interest of the university. Action taken under this act shall be by written
11 resolution adopted by at least a majority of the members of the board.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003

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15 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
17 CONTINGENCY. (a) To address needs emerging from the restructuring of the
18 Technical Institutes, ASU Technical Center shall establish and maintain for
19 the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-2007 biennium a pool of four (4) unclassified positions
20 and three (3) classified positions, payable from funds appropriated for ASU
21 Technical Center. These positions are to be used by ASU Technical Center in
22 the event that the number and level of positions available to address the
23 needs emerging from business and industry driven program expansions exceeds
24 the number of positions regularly authorized for ASU Technical Center.

25 (b) ASU Technical Center shall provide justification to the Department of
26 Finance and Administration's Office of Personnel Management (OPM) for the
27 need to allocate titles from this position pool. No classifications will be
28 assigned to the pool until such time as specific positions are requested and
29 justified by ASU Technical Center, recommended by OPM and approved by the
30 Legislative Council. ASU Technical Center may transfer positions from this
31 pool to any pay schedule the agency currently maintains or any pay schedule
32 the agency receives during the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-2007 biennium.

33 (c) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
34 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
35 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the
36 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has

1 determined that ASU Technical Center could be operated more efficiently if
2 some flexibility is given to that agency. That flexibility is being
3 accomplished by providing growth pools in subsection (a) of this section and
4 since the General Assembly has granted the agency broad powers under the
5 growth pool concept, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General
6 Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the growth pool by
7 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council in the utilization of the
8 growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the Legislative
9 Council is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of
10 approval by the Legislative Council is ruled unconstitutional by a court of
11 competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.
12 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as
13 established herein during the next biennium, the position(s) must be
14 requested as a new position(s) in the agencies biennial budget request.
15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~ 2005
16 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

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18 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
20 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
21 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
22 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
23 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
24 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
25 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
26 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
27 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
28 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
29 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
30 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
31 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.
32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~
33 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

34
35 SECTION 11. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
36 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds

1 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
2 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
3 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
5 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
6 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
7 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
8 with in disbursement of said funds.

9
10 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
12 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
17 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18
19 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
22 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
24 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
25 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
26 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
27 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
28 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
29 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
