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Subtitle

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - VARIOUS DIVISIONS AND THE ARKANSAS
ARCHEOLOGICAL SURVEY. There is hereby established for the University of
Arkansas - Various Divisions and the Archeological Survey for the 2005-2007
biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries
shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and
Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and
all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a
specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt
from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All
persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the



1 provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas
2 Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

22 *successive years of training for their craft. Progressively increasing, as*
23 *strongly encouraged for this type program by the U.S. Department of Labor, is*
24 *defined as a percentage difference between the Apprentice's current salary*
25 *and the next year's ADLPWD Washington County Building Rates Basic Hourly Rate*
26 *for their chosen craft, but not less than the preceding year's wages with any*
27 *authorized cost of living (COLA) applied.*

28 *Upon successful completion of the Apprentice Program, fulfillment of all*
29 *related licensing requirements, and availability of an open Skilled Trades*
30 *Worker position (if not already in a Grade 17 Skilled Trades Worker*
31 *position), all Apprentice Program graduates shall be promoted to a Grade 17*
32 *Skilled Trades Worker position and earn the ADLPWD Washington County Building*
33 *Rates Basic Hourly Rate for the classification of their chosen craft except*
34 *that: "No Apprentice Program graduate shall earn wages less than Grade 17*
35 *Skilled Trades Worker Level I."*

36 *The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005*

1 through June 30, 2007.

3 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE
4 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SUMMER SCHOOL
5 EMPLOYEES. Employees who, in addition to working during the regular school
6 term also work during the summer months, shall be authorized as additional
7 compensation an amount not to exceed 1/12 of their annual salary for each
8 month or part thereof worked. Such additional compensation shall not be
9 construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees.
10 Payment of additional compensation shall be limited to employees in the
11 following classifications:

21 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE
22 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TEACHER GRANT
23 RELATED FUNDING PROVISION. Teachers of the School for Mathematics and
24 Sciences who, in addition to fulfilling annual teaching contract requirements
25 also write grants, grant progress reports and write and publish papers may be
26 authorized as additional annual compensation an amount up to 1/12 of their
27 annual salary. Such additional compensation shall not be construed as
28 exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees. The additional
29 compensation authorized by this section shall only be paid from a portion of
30 the grant monies received and shall not be paid from state general revenues
31 or Educational Excellence Trust Fund monies.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005

35 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. TYPE 2 TRANSFER. Effective July 1, 2005, all
36 duties, functions, records, property, obligations, personnel, and authority

2 §2-33-111 and §2-33-112, for the Springdale Laboratory of the Arkansas
3 Livestock and Poultry Commission are hereby transferred by a Type 2 transfer

7 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
9 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
10 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
11 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
12 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
13 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
14 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
15 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
16 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
17 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
18 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
19 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
20 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~

24 SECTION 24. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
25 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
26 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
27 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
30 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
31 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
32 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
33 with in disbursement of said funds.

34
35 SECTION 25. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
36 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

1 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
2 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
3 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
4 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
5 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
6 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

7
8 SECTION 26. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
9 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
10 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
11 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
12 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
13 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
14 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
15 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
16 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
17 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
18 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
