13 SUPPLEMENTAL AND IN ADDITION TO THOSE FUNDS
14 APPROPRIATED BY ACT 55 OF THE SECOND
15 EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF 2003; AND FOR OTHER

19 AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS -
20 ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR MATHEMATICS,
21 SCIENCES AND THE ARTS SUPPLEMENTAL
22 APPROPRIATION.
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26 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR MATHEMATICS, SCIENCES AND
29 THE ARTS. There is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas, to be
30 payable from the School for Math, Science and Arts Fund, for personal
31 services and operating expenses of the University of Arkansas - Arkansas
32 School for Mathematics, Sciences and the Arts which shall be supplemental and
33 in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 1 of Act 55 of the Second
34 Extraordinary Session of 2003, the following:

6 SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized

7 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds

8 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the

9 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and

10 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

11 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures

12 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this

13 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of

14 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied

15 with in disbursement of said funds.

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17 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly

18 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

19 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

20 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations

21 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

22 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral

23 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or

24 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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26 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General

27 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of

28 the University of Arkansas are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient

29 for the University of Arkansas to continue to provide essential governmental

30 services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies

31 for the University of Arkansas to continue such services; and that a delay in

32 the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper

33 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,

34 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the

35 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in

36 full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

1 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
2 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
3 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
4 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
5 the veto.
