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Subtitle

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AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS

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FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR

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THE 2007-2009 BIENNIUM.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for

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the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2007-2009 biennium,

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the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be

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governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act

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(Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory

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thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum

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annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the

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provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons

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occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions

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of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-

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101), or its successor.

14 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
15 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
16 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
17 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
18 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
19 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
20 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
21 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
23 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

24
25 SECTION 40. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
26 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
27 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
28 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
29 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
30 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
31 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
32 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
33 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
34 with in disbursement of said funds.

35
36 SECTION 41. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly

1 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
2 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
3 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
4 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
5 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
6 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
7 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

8
9 SECTION 42. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
10 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
11 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
12 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
13 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
14 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
15 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
16 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
17 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
18 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
19 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
