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Subtitle

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - VARIOUS DIVISIONS AND THE ARKANSAS
ARCHEOLOGICAL SURVEY. There is hereby established for the University of
Arkansas - Various Divisions and the Archeological Survey for the 2007-2009
biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries
shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and
Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and
all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a
specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt
from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All
persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the



1 provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas
2 Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

33 purposes during each year of the ~~2005-2007~~ 2007-2009 biennium for the
34 athletic directors, associate athletic directors, and head coaches, and an
35 amount not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) each for the assistant
36 athletic directors, assistant coaches, offensive coordinators, defensive

1 coordinators, and head trainers. Any such allowances shall be in addition to
2 the regular salary of such athletic directors, associate and assistant
3 athletic directors, head coaches and assistant coaches. Further, if the
4 special allowance funds authorized herein are utilized the University of
5 Arkansas, Fayetteville shall report annually to the Arkansas Legislative
6 Joint Auditing Committee the exact disposition of those special allowance
7 funds. In recognition of the extra work involved in the participation of
8 intercollegiate athletic teams in post-season competition, and to promote
9 exceptional achievement in the total sports program, the Chancellor of the
10 University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, in accordance with policies issued by
11 the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas, may approve additional
12 compensation of up to one month's salary for the Athletic Department and Band
13 personnel when any athletic team participates in post-season competition or
14 achieves exceptional recognition, which shall be in addition to the regular
15 salaries authorized by law, provided that the additional compensation shall
16 be paid from contributions from sources other than public funds.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
18 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

19
20 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

22 ADDITIONAL PAYMENTS AUTHORIZED. The Board of Trustees of the University of
23 Arkansas is hereby authorized to make additional payments to head coaches at
24 the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, from revenues generated by
25 contracts with vendors of athletic apparel, shoes and other products in such
26 amounts as may be established by the Board of Trustees for performance by the
27 coaches of consulting and other obligations pursuant to contracts between the
28 University and such vendors. Such additional payments to head coaches shall
29 not be considered salary and shall not be deemed or construed to exceed the
30 maximum salaries established for such coaches by the General Assembly.
31 Nothing in this section shall be construed to reduce or eliminate the
32 authority granted elsewhere in Arkansas statutes for the payment of
33 allowances or bonuses to coaches at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville.

34 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
35 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

1 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
3 APPRENTICE PROGRAM WAGES. All apprentices in the University of Arkansas U.S.
4 Department of Labor Approved Apprentice Program shall be appointed into the
5 State of Arkansas Classified Pay Plan title of Grade 11 Apprentice Tradesman
6 at the then Labor Market Entry Rate.

7 Using successive Arkansas Department of Labor Prevailing Wage
8 Determination (ADLPWD) Building Rates for Washington County for the craft
9 title matching that Apprentice's craft training, individual Apprentices shall
10 be paid progressively increasing wages upon successful completion of
11 successive years of training for their craft. Progressively increasing, as
12 strongly encouraged for this type program by the U.S. Department of Labor, is
13 defined as a percentage difference between the Apprentice's current salary
14 and the next year's ADLPWD Washington County Building Rates Basic Hourly Rate
15 for their chosen craft, but not less than the preceding year's wages with any
16 authorized cost of living (COLA) applied.

17 Upon successful completion of the Apprentice Program, fulfillment of all
18 related licensing requirements, and availability of an open Skilled Trades
19 Worker position (if not already in a Grade 17 Skilled Trades Worker
20 position), all Apprentice Program graduates shall be promoted to a Grade 17
21 Skilled Trades Worker position and earn the ADLPWD Washington County Building
22 Rates Basic Hourly Rate for the classification of their chosen craft except
23 that: "No Apprentice Program graduate shall earn wages less than Grade 17
24 Skilled Trades Worker Level I."

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
26 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009.

27
28 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SUMMER
30 SCHOOL EMPLOYEES. Employees of School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts
31 who, in addition to working during the regular school term also work during
32 the summer months, shall be authorized as additional compensation an amount
33 not to exceed ~~1/12~~ 1/10 of their annual salary for each month or part thereof
34 worked. Such additional compensation shall not be construed as exceeding the
35 maximum salary authorized for said employees. Payment of additional
36 compensation shall be limited to employees ~~in the following classifications~~

12 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TEACHER
14 GRANT RELATED FUNDING PROVISION. Teachers of the School for Mathematics and
15 Sciences and the Arts who, in addition to fulfilling annual teaching contract
16 requirements also write grants, grant progress reports and write and publish
17 papers may be authorized as additional annual compensation an amount up to
18 ~~1/12~~ 1/10 of their annual salary. Such additional compensation shall not be
19 construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees. The
20 additional compensation authorized by this section shall only be paid from a
21 portion of the grant monies received and shall not be paid from state general
22 revenues or Educational Excellence Trust Fund monies.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
24 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

26 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Annotated 6-64-1013,
27 concerning Diagnostic laboratory services, is hereby amended by adding a
28 subsection:

30 (c) Effective July 1, 2005, all duties, functions, records, property,
31 obligations, personnel, and authority to levy and collect diagnostic and
32 laboratory fees, pursuant to Arkansas Code §2-33-111 and §2-33-112, for the
33 Springdale Laboratory of the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission are
34 hereby transferred by a Type 2 transfer from the Arkansas Livestock and
35 Poultry Commission to the Division of Agriculture of the University of
36 Arkansas.

2 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
4 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
5 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
6 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
7 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
8 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
9 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
10 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
11 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
12 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
13 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
14 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
15 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
17 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

19 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
20 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
21 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
22 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
23 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
24 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
25 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
26 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
27 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
28 with in disbursement of said funds.

29

30 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
31 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
32 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
33 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
34 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
35 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
36 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or

1 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

2
3 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
4 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
5 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
6 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
7 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
8 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
9 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
10 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
11 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
12 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
13 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
