## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO REAPPROPRIATE THE BALANCES OF CAPITAL  
IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE STATE MILITARY  
DEPARTMENT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE STATE MILITARY  
DEPARTMENT REAPPROPRIATION.

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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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21 SECTION 1. REAPPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,  
22 to the State Military Department, to be payable from the federal funds as  
23 designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for the State Military  
24 Department, the following:

25 (A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
26 Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an Army  
27 aviation support facility and hangar for new tactical helicopter equipment  
28 and personnel, in a sum not to exceed .....\$22,700,000.  
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30 (B) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
31 Item (B) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related  
32 expenses for a Combined Support Maintenance Shop, in a sum not to exceed  
33 .....\$11,100,724.  
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35 (C) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in



1 Item (C) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related  
2 expenses for an Ammunition Supply Point at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to  
3 exceed .....\$3,415,799.  
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5 (D) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
6 Item (D) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related  
7 expenses for a Centralized Vehicle Wash Facility for cleaning heavy/tracked  
8 vehicles, to provide vehicle maintenance for mechanized or tracked units and  
9 related services, in a sum not to exceed .....\$1,065,600.  
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11 (E) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
12 Item (E) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction and related  
13 expenses for an Organizational Maintenance Shop in Searcy, Arkansas, in a sum  
14 not to exceed .....\$1,373,986.  
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16 (F) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
17 Item (G) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for constructing and equipping a  
18 National Guard Military Operations Urban Terrain (MOUT) Training Facility, in  
19 a sum not to exceed .....\$3,575,560.  
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21 (G) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
22 Item (H) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for constructing and equipping the  
23 National Guard Organizational Maintenance Shop in Jonesboro, Arkansas, in a  
24 sum not to exceed .....\$1,970,520.  
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26 (H) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
27 Item (I) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for building an Army Aviation  
28 Support Facility with a hangar and administrative space, in a sum not to  
29 exceed .....\$10,922,520.  
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31 (I) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
32 Item (J) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a new  
33 Ammunition Supply Point at Fort Chaffee Maneuver Training Center for  
34 ammunition storage, handling, shipment and administration, in a sum not to  
35 exceed .....\$8,752,250.  
36

1 (J) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
2 Item (L) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an access  
3 control booth and electrically powered gates for traffic control/access to  
4 the main entrance at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to exceed .....\$14,376,300.

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6 (K) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
7 Item (M) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a new  
8 Ammunition Supply Point at Camp Robinson for ammunition storage, handling,  
9 shipment and administration, in a sum not to exceed .....\$3,536,300.

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11 (L) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
12 Item (N) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an access  
13 control booth and electrically powered gates for traffic control/access to  
14 the main entrance at the Fort Chaffee Maneuver Training Center, in a sum not  
15 to exceed .....\$1,952,500.

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17 (M) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
18 Item (O) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a "contonement"  
19 or "central facility" area fence for the training area at Camp Robinson to  
20 meet current anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, in a sum not to  
21 exceed .....\$3,663,000.

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23 (N) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
24 Item (P) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of a "contonement"  
25 or "central facility" area fence for the training area at the Fort Chaffee  
26 Maneuver Training Center to meet current/anti-terrorism/force protection  
27 requirements, in a sum not to exceed .....\$3,663,000.

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29 (O) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
30 Item (Q) of Section 1 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction of an additional  
31 thirty-five (35) miles of fencing for the training area at Camp Robinson to  
32 meet current anti-terrorism/force protection requirements, in a sum not to  
33 exceed .....\$3,663,000.

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35 SECTION 2. REAPPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,  
36 to the State Military Department, to be payable from the federal funds as

1 designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for the State Military  
2 Department, the following:

3 (A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
4 Item (A) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Readiness  
5 Center in Jonesboro, in a sum not to exceed .....\$3,689,625.  
6

7 (B) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
8 Item (B) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Camp Robinson  
9 Aviation Armory Addition, in a sum not to exceed .....\$3,804,159.  
10

11 (C) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
12 Item (D) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Phase I  
13 Regional Training Institute Complex, in a sum not to exceed .....\$5,918,402.  
14

15 (D) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
16 Item (E) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Combined  
17 Support Maintenance Sub-Shop, in a sum not to exceed .....\$9,639,330.  
18

19 (E) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
20 Item (F) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for construction of a Multi-Purpose  
21 Machinegun/Sniper Range at Ft. Chaffee Maneuver Training Center, in a sum not  
22 to exceed .....\$1,404,290.  
23

24 (F) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
25 Item (G) of Section 2 of Act 215 of 2005, for CMTC Sewer Collection System  
26 Repair/Replacement, in a sum not to exceed .....\$3,145,055.  
27

28 SECTION 3. REAPPROPRIATION - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS. There is hereby  
29 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the  
30 General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, for the  
31 State Military Department, the following:

32 (A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in  
33 Item (B) of Section 2 of Act 141 of 2005, for construction, major  
34 maintenance, repairs, asphalt paving and associated expenses at various  
35 National Guard Armories including Warren, Mountain Home, West Memphis and an  
36 Aviation Armory at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to exceed .....\$466,175.

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(B) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in Section 1 of Act 1847 of 2005, for critically needed maintenance for National Guard Armories statewide for the State Military Department, in a sum not to exceed .....\$653,304.

(C) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in Item (A) of Section 1 of Act 215 of 2005, for various maintenance, renovation, equipping, construction, improvement, upgrade, and repair projects and State match for State Armories, in a sum not to exceed .....\$1,250,000.

(D) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in Item (C) of Section 2 of Act 141 of 2005, for the rehabilitation of National Guard Armories throughout the State to ensure combat and State emergency readiness, in a sum not to exceed .....\$137,969.

(E) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in Item (E) of Section 2 of Act 141 of 2005, for alterations to existing buildings to meet ADA regulations including ramps, restroom alterations, passageway alterations and parking spaces, in a sum not to exceed ..\$174,800.

SECTION 4. REAPPROPRIATION - MISCELLANEOUS REVENUE. There is hereby appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the Armory Construction Fund, for the State Military Department, the following:

(A) Effective July 1, 2007, the balance of the appropriation provided in Item (A) of Section 4 of Act 141 of 2005, for repair, construction, renovation, landscaping and maintenance of armories, hangars, and other properties held for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard, in a sum not to exceed .....\$128,292.

SECTION 5. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and

1 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or  
 2 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State  
 3 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects  
 4 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds  
 5 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General  
 6 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall  
 7 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

8 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing  
 9 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue  
 10 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State  
 11 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,  
 12 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any  
 13 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

14  
 15 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
 16 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
 17 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
 18 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
 19 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
 20 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
 21 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
 22 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

 24 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
 25 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
 26 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that previous  
 27 General Assemblies have provided appropriations for the projects provided or  
 28 enumerated in this act; that certain appropriations will expire before the  
 29 adjournment of the General Assembly; and that if such appropriations expire,  
 30 the projects and programs authorized herein will cease thereby depriving the  
 31 citizens of the State of the benefits to be derived from such projects.  
 32 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
 33 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
 34 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its  
 35 passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the  
 36 Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time

1 during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the  
2 Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date  
3 the last house overrides the veto.
