22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for  
25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2009-2010 fiscal  
26 year, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall  
27 be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation  
28 Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws  
29 amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific  
30 maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the  
31 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons  
32 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions  
33 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-  
34 101), or its successor.

1 not exceed the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level  
2 position authorized by the General Assembly in Section 1 of this Act, as  
3 governed by the uniform Classification and Compensation Act of 1969, §21-5-  
4 201 et seq., or its successor.

5  
6 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to access  
7 the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in this  
8 Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the  
9 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the  
10 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional  
11 positions exists. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical  
12 Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification of  
13 allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" to  
14 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher Education,  
15 and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for review.  
16 The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles and salaries  
17 of personnel who have been employed in positions established from this pool  
18 and the source and duration of funds associated with the positions.

19  
20 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests continuation  
21 of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as established  
22 herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be requested as a  
23 new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

24  
25 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is  
26 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by  
27 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the  
28 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has  
29 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be  
30 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.  
31 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in  
32 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the  
33 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and  
34 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization  
35 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint  
36 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the

1 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is  
2 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the  
3 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a  
4 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

5  
6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2009  
7 through June 30, 2010.

8  
9 SECTION 40. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized  
10 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds  
11 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the  
12 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
13 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
14 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures  
15 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
16 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of  
17 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
18 with in disbursement of said funds.

19  
20 SECTION 41. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
21 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
22 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
23 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
24 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
25 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
26 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
27 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

28  
29 SECTION 42. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
30 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
31 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
32 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of  
33 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
34 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
35 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2009 could work irreparable harm upon the  
36 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.

1 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
2 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
3 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2009.
