## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR OPERATING,  
10 RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT EXPENSES FOR THE  
11 ARKANSAS SOYBEAN PROMOTION BOARD WHICH SHALL BE  
12 SUPPLEMENTAL AND IN ADDITION TO THOSE FUNDS  
13 APPROPRIATED BY ACT 7 OF 2007; AND FOR OTHER  
14 PURPOSES.

17 AN ACT FOR THE ARKANSAS SOYBEAN  
18 PROMOTION BOARD SUPPLEMENTAL  
19 APPROPRIATION.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
24

25 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS - RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT. There is  
26 hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board, to be payable  
27 from the Soybean Promotion Fund, for operating, research and development  
28 expenses of the Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board which shall be supplemental  
29 and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 1 of Act 7 of 2007,  
30 the following:

8 SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized  
9 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds  
10 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the  
11 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
12 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
13 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal  
14 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by  
15 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
16 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

18 SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
20 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
21 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
22 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
23 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
24 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
25 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

27 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
28 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of  
29 the Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board are, due to unforeseen circumstances,  
30 insufficient for the Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board to continue to provide  
31 essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will provide  
32 the necessary monies for the Arkansas Soybean Promotion Board to continue  
33 such services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Act could work  
34 irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential  
35 governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist  
36 and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

1 peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the  
2 date of its passage and approval.

3 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become  
4 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor  
5 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
6 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides  
7 the veto.
