ACUTE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - PER CAPITA - LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The 20 21 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of 22 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago 23 and has taken various approaches to funding since then.
