- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 16-10-905 is amended to read as follows: 16-10-905. Amount of per diem compensation.
 - (a) Per diem compensation prescribed in § 16-10-902 shall be for each day or portion of a day the judge serves on the bench.
- 30 <u>(b)</u> For each day or portion of a day that a <u>temporary special</u> judge 31 appointed under Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 78 80, performs his or her 32 judicial duties other than on the bench, the judge shall receive compensation 33 as prescribed by rules adopted by the <u>Arkansas</u> Supreme Court.

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 16-13-103 is amended to read as follows: 16-13-103. Special judges — Compensation — Expenses.

- (a)(1) A licensed attorney who is elected as a special judge of the circuit court shall receive under the Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 80, and the rules prescribed by the Supreme Court may request compensation at the same one-half (1/2) the rate as fixed by law for a regularly elected circuit judge. In addition, he or she shall be reimbursed for actual expenses incurred while performing the duties of a special circuit judge. However, a special judge shall receive expenses only for the days he or she actually serves.
 - (2) Nothing in this section is to be construed to This section does not allow a special judge to receive compensation for any days that he or she is not actually serving in his or her appointed capacity.
 - (b) The compensation provided for in this section shall be paid <u>from</u> the appropriation provided to the Auditor of State for special and recalled <u>judges for the circuit courts</u>, upon certification by the clerk of the court in which the special circuit judge was elected to the Auditor of State stating the number of days <u>or a portion of a day</u> served, together with a <u>verified statement of actual expenses incurred under the rules prescribed by</u> the Supreme Court.

- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 16-17-210 is amended to read as follows: 16-17-210. Special judges.
- (a) If a district judge is disqualified or temporarily unable to serve, or if the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall determine that there is other need for a special judge to be temporarily appointed, a special judge may be assigned by the Chief Justice or elected by the bar of the district court, under rules prescribed by the Supreme Court, to serve during the period of temporary disqualification, absence, or need.
- (b) A special judge shall have the same power and authority in the court as the regular district judge would have if present and presiding and shall have the same qualifications as are required by law for the regular district judge.
- (c) A <u>district judge who is assigned by the Chief Justice to act as a</u> special judge assigned or elected under this section shall receive compensation reimbursement of expenses for his or her service as provided by law at the rate provided for in § 16-17-1108.
