24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 3-9-202(14)(A), concerning the definition	
25	of "restaurant" related to on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages, i	S
26	amended to read as follows:	
27	(14) "Restaurant" means any public or private place:	
28	(A)(i) Kept, used, maintained, advertised, and held out t	Ð
29	the public or to a private or restricted membership as a place where complet	e
30	meals are served and where complete meals are actually and regularly served,	
31	without sleeping accommodations, such a place being provided with adequate	
32	and sanitary kitchen and dining equipment and a seating capacity of at least	
33	fifty (50) people and having employed therein a sufficient number and kind o	£
34	employees to prepare, cook, and serve suitable food for its guests or

36	(ii) At least one (1) meal per day shall be served,	

1	and the place shall be open a minimum of five (5) days per week, with the

26	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code \S 3-9-301(4), concerning the definition of
27	"restaurant" related to on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages, is
28	amended to read as follows:
29	(4)(A) "Restaurant" or "cafe" means a place of business serving
30	food to the public prepared for consumption on the premises at an established
31	eating place, as defined by reasonable rules and regulations promulgated by
32	the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board; that is regularly used to serve a meal
33	to a guest for compensation and has a suitable kitchen facility to serve an
34	entire menu approved by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division.
35	(B) The menu shall contain a selection of food and shall
36	not be limited to sandwiches or salads.

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1	(C) The kitchen shall:
2	(i) Have adequate refrigeration to preserve the food
3	on the menu;

21	(7) "Meal" means food commonly ordered at various hours of the
22	<u>day;</u>

24	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
25	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the law regarding the
26	definition of "restaurant" is necessary to avoid ambiguity in state law and
27	the Arkansas Beverage Control Division's rules. Therefore, an emergency is
28	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
29	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
30	<u>on:</u>
31	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
32	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
33	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
34	<u>bill; or</u>
35	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
36	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
