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SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help pool positions.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~ 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General

1 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve
2 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education
3 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.
4 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no
5 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal
6 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the
7 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions
8 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or
9 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section.

10 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
11 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher
12 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This
13 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation
14 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue
15 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the
16 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that
17 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some
18 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad
19 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate
20 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of
21 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this
22 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint
23 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement
24 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled
25 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
26 void.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
28 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

29
30 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In
32 order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in
33 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide
34 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds
35 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official
36 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall,

1 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from
2 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds
3 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid
4 shall not be affected by the application of this provision.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
6 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

7
8 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK
10 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made
11 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out
12 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents as may be necessary shall be
13 processed so that funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000
14 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the
15 technical college draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be
16 transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds available from the
17 Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year.

18 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning
19 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as
20 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and
21 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies
22 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force
23 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational
24 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of
25 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
27 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

28
29 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BUILDING
31 MAINTENANCE FUND. After the sum of \$13,200,000 has been deposited into the
32 Higher Education Building Maintenance Fund, ~~the next \$10,000,000 or so much~~
33 ~~as is collected,~~ any additional deposits are ~~is~~ to be transferred to the
34 Research Development Fund there to be used as provided by law.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~

36 *execute and publish the results of the outcome-centered component to measure*

1 the progress of institutions in reaching the broad goals of satisfactory
2 progression and graduation of all students enrolled in state-supported
3 institutions of higher education.

4
5 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OUTCOME-
7 CENTERED FUNDING AWARDS. Upon certification of the Director of the
8 Department of Higher Education, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall
9 transfer to the Department of Higher Education Fund Account certified amounts
10 based upon the outcome-centered funding policy of the Arkansas Higher
11 Education Coordinating Board from the State Treasury funds of the
12 Institutions of Higher Education. The Department of Higher Education will
13 distribute funds from the Outcome-Centered Funding Awards Appropriation based
14 upon the outcome-centered funding policy of the Arkansas Higher Education
15 Coordinating Board.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
17 2013 through June 30, 2014.

18
19 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
21 ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Higher Education is authorized to
22 recover non-refundable administrative fees related to the institutional
23 certification and exemption process for out-of-state, non-public, and for-
24 profit colleges and universities. These fees include a notification fee, an
25 application processing fee, and travel expenses for the certification review
26 teams.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
28 2013 through June 30, 2014.

29
30 SECTION 47. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
31 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
32 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
33 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
34 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
35 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
36 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by

1 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
2 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

3
4 SECTION 48. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
5 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
6 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
7 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
8 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
9 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
10 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
11 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
12

13 SECTION 49. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
14 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
15 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
16 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of
17 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
18 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
19 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm
20 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
21 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
22 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
23 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013.
