34	(2) The restriction in this subsection shall expire upon the

4	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-17-402(d), concerning a waiver of the
5	examination requirements for licensure by reciprocity, is amended to read as
6	follows:
7	(d) The State Board of Education shall waive the examination
8	requirements under subsection (b) of this section for $\frac{individuals}{individuals}$
9	<u>individual</u> applying for <del>licensure in</del> <u>a first-time</u> Arkansas <u>license</u> who <del>have</del>
10	has a valid out-of-state teaching license and three (3) years' documented
11	teaching experience as required by the rules promulgated by the State Board
12	of Education.
13	
14	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-17-403(c)(5) - (7), concerning a
15	provisional license for teachers trained out-of-state, are amended to read as
16	follows:
17	(5) Reports evidencing passing test scores on the appropriate
18	basic-skills assessment mandated by the state board for educator licensure of
19	its substantial equivalent, unless the individual has three (3) years of
20	documented teaching experience;
21	(6) Completion of a program for:
22	(A) Teacher education at a <u>nationally or</u> regionally
23	accredited institution of higher education;
24	(B) Teacher education <u>nationally</u> accredited by <del>the National</del>
25	Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education, Teacher Education
26	Accreditation Council, an accrediting organization recognized by the United
27	States Department of Education, the Council for Higher Education
28	Accreditation, or the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation;
29	or
30	(C) Certification from the National Board for Professional
31	Teaching Standards; and
32	(7) (6) Payment of applicable licensure fees.
33	
34	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-17-409(c), concerning the nontraditional
35	licensure program, is amended to read as follows:
36	(c)(1) The state board shall promulgate rules and regulations to

1	determine eligibility for and amount of awards of the grants concerning the	
2	operation of the nontraditional licensure program authorized by this section	
3	and for such other purposes as may be necessary in carrying out the intent of	
4	this section.	
5	(2) The department may refuse to admit for enrollment in the	
6	nontraditional licensure program administered by the department a person who	
7	has been dismissed from a teacher education program at an institution of

10	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-17-409(e)(3), concerning provisional	
11	licensure for an applicant enrolled in an accelerated teaching program, is

14	accelerated teaching program a provisional teaching license <u>that is issued</u>

24	Arkansas history requirement for teacher licensure, is amended to read as

27	elementary school teacher unless the person has successfully completed:	
28	(1) For a person seeking a traditional first-time license, at	
29	least three (3) <u>college-credit</u> hours <del>of college course work</del> in Arkansas	
30	history at an accredited institution of higher education; or	
31	(2) For a person seeking licensure through a nontraditional	
32	program, by reciprocity, or by adding an endorsement, documentation of the	
33	successful completion of:	
34	(A) Three (3) college credit-hours in Arkansas history at	
35	an accredited institution of higher education; or	
36	(B) A forty-five (45) hour professional development piece

Arkansas Code § 6-17-419(a), concerning the renewal of an 9 expired teaching license, is amended to read as follows: 10 (a)(1) Any A person who held a valid teaching license prior to January 11 1, 1988, holds an Arkansas teaching license that is expired for more than one 12 (1) year, who obtained the license before state-mandated licensure 13 assessments were required by law and by rule for licensure and who has less 14 than three (3) years of teaching experience shall be allowed to renew that 15 teaching license by meeting: 16 (A) Passing the content-area assessment for the requested 17 license; 18 (B) Providing evidence of the completion of the annual 19 professional development requirement for licensure, including the 20 professional development required under § 6-17-409; and 21 (C) Completing the general renewal requirements that are 22 applicable to renewal for all other license holders and shall not be required 23 to take a basic skills test, to take the National Teacher Examination, or to 24 fulfill any other requirement that is not also required of all other teachers 25 for license renewal. 26 (2) Any  $\underline{\Lambda}$  person who held a valid teaching license prior to 27 January 1, 1988, seeking renewal of an expired license under this section 28 shall be entitled to a provisional license by meeting the general 29 requirements that are applicable to all other persons seeking a provisional 30 license. 31 32 SECTION 9. 22	SECTION 11. Arkansas Code § 6-17-428(a), concerning definitions
23	related to ethical violations, is amended to add an additional subdivision to
24	read as follows:
25	(5) "Preservice teacher" means an unlicensed person who is
26	enrolled as a student in an educator preparation program.
27	
28	SECTION 12. Arkansas Code § 6-17-428(c), concerning the duties of the
29	ethics subcommittee of the Professional Licensure Standards Board, is amended
30	to read as follows:
31	(c)(1) The ethics subcommittee of the Professional Licensure Standards
32	Board shall:
33	(A)(i) Receive and investigate ethics complaints.
34	(ii) The ethics subcommittee shall not accept a
35	facsimile or electronic signature on a complaint form, but shall require that
36	a complaint form bear the original signature of the complainant;

T	(b) Enforce the code of ethics by:
2	(i) Making a recommendation to the State Board of
3	Education for:
4	(a) A written warning, a written reprimand, or
5	the written placement of conditions or restrictions on the activities of the
6	educator; or
7	(b) The revocation, suspension, probation, or
8	nonrenewal, or denial of a license issued by the State Board of Education; or

12	(2) For a preservice teacher assigned to a public school as a

17	or more persons to conduct evidentiary hearings.
18	(4) The State Board of Education may make an informal
19	disposition of the ethical violation by stipulation, settlement, consent
20	order, or default.

22	SECTION 13. Arkansas Code § 6-17-428(f)(1), concerning the timeline
23	for ethics violations proceedings, is amended to read as follows:
24	(f)(1) Within ten (10) calendar business days of authorizing an ethics
25	complaint investigation, the ethics subcommittee shall provide to the
26	educator under investigation:
27	(A) Written notice of the investigation and the nature of
28	the alleged ethical violation; and
29	(B) A copy of:
30	(i) The documents and evidence provided by the
31	<pre>complainant concerning the facts alleged in the ethics complaint;</pre>
32	(ii) Provisions of this section or other state
33	statutory law applicable to an ethical violation under this section; and
34	(iii) The applicable rules in effect at the time the
35	ethics complaint is filed.

1	SECTION 14. Arkansas Code § 6-17-428, concerning ethical violations,
2	is amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows:
3	(q) Subject to the disclosure limitations of subsections (m) and (o)
4	of this section, the department may include on the department's public
5	website for licensure the following information on each violation of the code
6	of ethics by an educator upon which the State Board of Education has
7	suspended, revoked, denied, or non-renewed a license based on the
8	recommendations of the ethics subcommittee:
9	(1) The code of ethics standard that was violated;
10	(2) The sanction approved by the State Board of Education; and
11	(3) A copy of the final order of the State Board of Education.
