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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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26 *SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 25-35-103(b), concerning permitted uses of*

27 *the Arkansas Multi-Agency Insurance Trust Fund, is amended to read as*

28 *follows:*

29 *(b) No money shall be appropriated from the trust fund for any purpose*
30 *except to pay:*

31 *(1) Insurance and reinsurance premiums;*

32 *(2) Loss adjustment expenses;*

33 *(3) Related educational and training expenses;*

34 *(4) Insured claims falling below the annual aggregate deductible*
35 *level; and*

36 *(5) Expenses including actuarial, consultant, and service*

2 (6) Cybersecurity risk insurance premiums and expenses.

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4 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 25-35-104 is amended to read as follows:
5 25-35-104. Participation.

6 (a) ~~Effective July 1, 2003, the~~ The following agencies shall
7 participate in the Arkansas Multi-Agency Insurance Trust Fund:

8 (1) State agencies participating in the Arkansas Master Agency
9 Property Policy as of June 30, 2003;

10 (2) The Department of Correction;

11 (3) The Department of Community Correction; and

12 (4) State agencies participating in the Arkansas State Master
13 Vehicle Policy as of June 30, 2003.

14 (b) Upon approval by the ~~risk manager~~ State Risk Manager, other state
15 agencies may participate in the trust fund.

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17 SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
18 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that cyber incidents, including
19 data breaches, business interruption, and network damage, present an
20 immediate and ongoing threat to the efficient operation of state government;
21 that obtaining cybersecurity insurance and contributing to a more robust
22 cybersecurity insurance market will facilitate the adoption of appropriate
23 preventative measures and best practices to guard against this threat; and
24 that this act is immediately necessary to protect the state and its computer
25 networks from cyber attacks that may interrupt the provision of state
26 services or damage computer networks at great expense to the state.
27 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
28 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
29 become effective on:

30 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

31 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
32 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
33 bill; or

34 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
35 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
