16 MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR THE  
17 2016-2017 FISCAL YEAR.  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established

24 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for  
 25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2016-2017 fiscal  
 26 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be  
 27 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such  
 28 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,  
 29 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform  
 30 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the  
 31 appropriate classification.

33 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
 35 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the  
 36 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-

1 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from  
 2 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a  
 3 Nursing PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not  
 4 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.  
 5 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as  
 6 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)  
 7 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget  
 8 request.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
 10 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

11  
 12 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA  
 14 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas  
 15 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary  
 16 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds  
 17 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a  
 18 UAMS Temporary Pool: five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay  
 19 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this  
 20 Act.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
 22 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

1 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical

9 is authorized for the ~~2015-2016~~ 2016-2017 fiscal year a pool of seven hundred

7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED  
8 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event  
9 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas  
10 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric  
11 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount  
12 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven  
13 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as  
14 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year  
15 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to  
16 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents  
17 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical  
18 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide  
19 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of  
20 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the  
21 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,  
22 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts  
23 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will  
24 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount  
25 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for  
26 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if  
27 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve  
28 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars  
29 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of  
30 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and  
31 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of  
32 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of  
33 Pediatrics.

SECTION 47. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied

1 with in disbursement of said funds.

2  
3 SECTION 48. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
4 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
5 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
6 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
7 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
8 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
9 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative

16 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its  
17 passage and approval, is essential to the operation of the agency for which  
18 the appropriations in this Act are provided; and that in the event of an  
19 extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this  
20 Act beyond July 1, 2016, with the exception that Section 46 in this Act shall  
21 be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and  
22 approval, could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and  
23 provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is  
24 hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate

28 passage and approval.
