3	(a) The General Assembly reserves the right to enact legislation		
4	regarding the mandatory use of face masks, face shields, or other face		
5	coverings.		
6	(b) A state agency or entity, a political subdivision of the state, or		
7	a state or local official shall not mandate an individual in this state to		
8	use a face mask, face shield, or other face covering.		
9	(c) The use of a face mask, face shield, or other face covering shall		
10	not be a condition for entry, education, or services.		
11	(d) If a state agency or entity, a political subdivision of the state,		
12	or a state or local official recommends that an individual in this state use		
13	a face mask, face shield, or other face covering, a state agency or entity, a

24	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General		
25	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that face masks, face shields, and other		
26	face coverings are currently required in certain instances in this state;		
27	that a regulation that is not necessary is a burden on the public peace,		
28	health, and safety of the citizens of this state; that the requirement of		
29	face coverings should be removed as soon possible as it is no longer		
30	necessary and should not be continued; and that this act should become		
31	effective as soon as possible as the requirement of face coverings is not		
32	necessary to protect the health and safety of the citizens of Arkansas and is		
33	a burden on the public peace, health, and safety of the citizens of this		
34	state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being		
35	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and		
36	safety shall become effective on:
