1 of funds authorized in this Act for guaranteed energy, maintenance, and
2 operational savings generated through energy usage, solar power, waste
3 management, water conservation, and similar efficiency efforts on June 30
4 2022 shall be carried forward and made available for the same purpose for the
5 fiscal year ending June 30, 2023. Any realized savings and expenditures
6 shall be reported to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget
7 Committee no later than thirty (30) days prior to the time the Agency
8 presents its budget request to the Legislative Council/Joint Budget
9 Committee. This authority authorizes the reinvestment of guaranteed savings
10 for future and existing energy conservation projects.

11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
12 2021 through June 30, 2022.

13
14 SECTION 44. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE
15 ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
16 TRANSFER OF FUNDS. The Arkansas Department of Corrections shall provide
17 funding each year in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for a Deputy
18 Prosecuting Attorney who will be assigned to handle the prosecution of
19 offenses occurring at the Arkansas Department of Corrections. Upon request by
20 the Auditor of the State, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall
21 transfer an amount not to exceed \$100,000 from an account designated by the
22 Secretary of the Department of Corrections to the State Central Services Fund
23 as a direct revenue to fund a Deputy Prosecuting Attorney who will be
24 assigned to handle the prosecution of offenses occurring at the Arkansas
25 Department of Corrections.

26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
27 2021 through June 30, 2022.

28
29 SECTION 45. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
30 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
31 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
32 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
33 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
34 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
35 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
36 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be

1 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

2
3 SECTION 46. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
4 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
5 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
6 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
7 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
8 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
9 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
10 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

11
12 SECTION 47. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
13 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
14 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
15 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2021 is essential to the operation of
16 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
17 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
18 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2021 could work irreparable harm
19 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
20 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
21 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
22 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2021.
