"AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES DIVISION FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1989; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the Department of Human Services - Mental Health Services Division for the 1987-89 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act, or its successor.

Of the amounts allocated in Section 10 hereof, it is the intent of the General Assembly that such amounts are to be the maximum expended in the applicable fiscal year from the funds as appropriated in Section 7 hereof for the benefit of the appropriate program so enumerated. Provided, however, in the event that unforeseen circumstances occur in either fiscal year which would necessitate a transfer of the maximum allocation provided in Section 10 hereof from one or more programs to another program or programs as enumerated in said Section 10, the Mental Health Services Division with the approval of the Director of the Department of Human Services shall make its request known, and the reasons thereof, to the Office of Budget, Department of Finance and Administration in such form and detail as may be required by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. If approved, such transfer approval shall be transmitted to the Research and Fiscal Services Division of the Bureau of Legislative Research who shall make a report of the transfer and the reasons thereof to the Arkansas Legislative Council at least quarterly.

SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE AUDIT OF MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS. Every Mental Health Center eligible to receive any of the funds appropriated in Item 1 of Section 7 (Mental Health Services) of this Act shall, as a condition of receiving any such funds, be subject to an annual audit of the overall operation of such Mental Health Center by the Division of Legislative Audit. The Mental Health Centers shall submit a budget to the Mental Health Services Division, Department of Human Services, and the Arkansas Legislative Council and go through the budget procedures process in the same manner as State departments, agencies, institutions, boards and commissions. Budgets shall be submitted based on operating revenues and expenses of each Center and each Center shall provide information related to financial status requested by the Legislative Council and/or Joint Budget Committee.

SECTION 13. APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. All funds appropriated under the provisions of Item 1 of Section 7 (Mental Health Services) of this Act shall be apportioned on the basis of three dollars and forty-four cents (\$3.44) per capita for fiscal year 1987-88 and three dollars and sixty-three cents (\$3.63) per capita for fiscal year 1988-89 or so much thereof as funds shall become available. Additional funds shall be apportioned on the basis of fifty cents (\$.50) per capita on a one-to-one State/Local funds matching basis for both years of the biennial period ending June 30, 1989.

SECTION 14. TRANSFER OF FUNDS. The Mental Health Services Division is authorized to retain and transfer to the Department of Human Services that portion of each Community Mental Health Center's or Clinic's allotment which is required for the State's matching share for payment to Community Mental Health Centers or Clinics for services eligible for federal reimbursement under the programs administered by the Department of Human Services.

SECTION 15. GRANTS-IN-AID - CONDITIONS FOR RECEIVING FUNDS. Only locally-operated Centers and Clinics certified by the Mental Health Services Division are eligible to receive funds appropriated in Item 1 of Section 7 of this Act, and as a condition of receiving such funds they shall:

- (1) Meet minimum standards of performance in the delivery of Mental Health Services as defined by the Department of Human Services, Mental Health Services Division.
- (2) Supply statistical data to the Department of Human Services, Mental Health Services Division.
 - (3) Establish and maintain a sound financial management system in accor-

dance with guidelines as set forth by the Department of Human Services, Mental Health Services Division.

- (4) Establish and maintain community support programs designed to provide coordinated care and treatment to ensure ongoing therapeutic involvement and individualized treatment for persons with long-term, severe mental illness. Every community support program shall use a coordinated case management system and shall provide or assure access to services for persons with long-term, severe mental illness who reside within the respective catchment area of the Center. At a minimum, each community support program shall provide assessment, diagnosis, identification of persons in need of services, case management, crisis intervention, psychiatric treatment including medication services and supervision, counseling and psychotherapy, activities of daily living, and psychosocial rehabilitation which may include services provided by day treatment programs.
- (5) By August 31, 1987, the Board of Directors of each Center or Clinic certified by the Department of Human Services, Mental Health Services Division, shall adopt and submit to the Deputy Director, Mental Health Services Division, in the form and according to the procedures specified by the Deputy Director, Mental Health Services Division, an annual plan for the delivery of community support services for persons with long-term, severe mental illness. Each Center's plan must be approved by the Deputy Director, Mental Health Services Division.
- SECTION 16. FEDERAL FUNDS. It is the specific intent of the General Assembly that in the event of the availability of federal funding during either year of the biennial period ending June 30, 1989, that such funding be utilized to conserve or reduce the expenditure of general revenue except where prohibited by law.
- SECTION 17. TRANSFER PROVISION. Personnel positions and appropriations provided for all programs of the Mental Health Services Division may be reallocated when such actions are determined necessary to assure continued delivery of satisfactory levels of services in any of the several institutional programs administered by the Mental Health Services Division of the Department of Human Services. Such reallocations or transfers shall be requested by the Director of the Department of Human Services.
- SECTION 18. SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL. Nursing personnel who are regularly assigned to day shift duty, may receive shift differential payment for hours worked after 3 p.m. and before 8 a.m. providing they work a minimum of 4 hours within that time frame on a given work day.
- SECTION 19. OVERTIME. Nursing Service personnel may be paid overtime for hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours on a given work day regardless of holiday, vacation, or sick leave falling in the work week if:
- 1. Emergency coverage situations exist, i.e., inclement weather, disaster, etc. and
- 2. Authorization has been given by the Agency's Chief Fiscal Officer upon request/recommendation of senior nursing supervisors. Employees whose regular work day requires more than eight (8) hours, may not be paid overtime for regularly scheduled hours.
- SECTION 20. TRANSFER PROVISION FOR STATE OPERATED COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS. If during either year of the biennial period ending June 30, 1989, one or both of the current state operated community mental health centers (George W. Jackson CMHC, Jonesboro or Greater Little Rock CMHC, Little Rock) acquire private non-profit status, the Department of Human Services may

reallocate or transfer appropriation and funds to ensure the continued delivery of satisfactory levels of service. Such reallocations or transfers shall be requested by the Director of the Department of Human Services to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. Said Chief Fiscal Officer shall submit such requests to the Legislative Council for review and advice. If approved, George W. Jackson CMHC and Greater Little Rock CMHC would participate in general revenue per capita distributions at the same rate as the current thirteen private non-profit community mental health centers, as referenced in SECTION 7, APPROPRIATIONS COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS; SECTION 10, ALLOCATION RESTRICTIONS; SECTION 11, ALLOCATION RESTRICTION AND TRANSFER PROVISION; and SECTION 13, APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS.

SECTION 21. SPECIAL RATES OF PAY. Due to the highly competitive job market conditions for health professionals and the necessity of recruiting and retaining qualified personnel, the Department of Human Services-Mental Health Services Division is authorized special rates of pay for current and new employees up to the levels listed under subsection (a) below.

(a) Special rates may be authorized for the following classifications only, as indicated herein:

SECTION 22. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 23. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 24. CONTRACT RESTRICTIONS. The agency, board, commission, department or institution to whom funds are appropriated by this Act shall not enter into any contract for any professional or consultant services which shall extend for more than twenty (20) actual working days or the total compensation exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000) during any one fiscal year without first seeking the advice of the Arkansas Legislative Council. Provided further, that all contracts for professional or consultant services shall be submitted monthly to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State for reporting to the Legislative Council.

SECTION 25. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Sixth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1987 is essential to the operation of

the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1987 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1987.
