"AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE ANNOTATED 19-4-1602(a) TO ALLOW FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE DUES TO BE DEDUCTED FROM THE PAYROLL OF STATE EMPLOYEES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated 19-4-1602(a) is amended to read as follows:

- "(a) Deductions from the payrolls of state employees, both regular and extra help, shall be permitted only for the following purposes:
 - (1) Withholding taxes;
 - (2) Social security contributions;
- (3) Contributions to any state retirement system or approved plan of deferred compensation;
- (4) Group hospital, medical, and life insurance deductions. However, any payroll deductions through the Arkansas state mechanized payroll system for state employees for coverages other than the state authorized plan shall be approved by the State Employees Insurance Advisory Committee;
 - (5) Payments to state employees' credit unions;
 - (6) Value of maintenance prerequisites;
- (7) Payment of union dues, when requested in writing by state employees;
 - (8) Purchase of United States Government savings bonds;
- (9) Arkansas Public Employees Association, Inc., dues, when requested in writing by state employees;
- (10) Riders fees for participation in the Arkansas State Employees Association Van-Pool Program, when requested in writing by state employees;
- (11) Contributions to the major federated fund-raising organization, when authorized by state employees;
- (12) Arkansas State Police Association dues, when authorized in writing by state employees; and
- (13) Fraternal Order of Police dues when requested in writing by state employees; and
- (14) For such other purposes as are specifically authorized by law but not enumerated in this subsection."
- SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
- SECTION 3. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
