CALL ITEM 70

For An Act To Be Entitled  
"AN ACT TO AMEND ITEM (1) OF SECTION 2(A) OF ACT 988 OF  
1989; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Item (1) of Subsection (A) of Section 2 of Act 988 of 1989 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) Industrial Development Commission  
(A) Infrastructure \$ 20,000,000"

SECTION 2. On July 1, 1990, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer the sum of one hundred ninety nine thousand five hundred eighty nine dollars (\$199,589) from the General Improvement Fund to the University of Arkansas Fund, there to be used to provide funding for the appropriation made in Act 18 of the First Extraordinary Session of 1989 for the 1990-91 fiscal year for the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville - Archeological Survey and Research Station at the Parkin Indian Mound State Park.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT. There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas Industrial Development Commission, which shall be supplemental and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 1, Subsection A, of Act 237 of the First Extraordinary Session of 1989, to be payable from the General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, the following:

(A) For the purpose of providing grants to cities and counties to provide financial assistance necessary to undertake public works projects or job training which support private sector job creation opportunities or alleviate conditions which constitute a threat to public health, the sum of..... \$10,000,000.

SECTION 4. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer the sum of one hundred forty one thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$141,750) on the effective date of this Act and the sum of two hundred forty two thousand dollars (\$242,000) on July 1, 1990 from the General Improvement Fund to the University of Arkansas Fund, there to be used exclusively for rent and expenses of the Cooperative Extension Service.

SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 7. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly, meeting in the Third Extraordinary Session, that funding provided by the Seventy-Seventh General Assembly for the infrastructure system of the State of Arkansas was insufficient and that the provisions of this Act will provide the necessary monies; and that delay in the effective date of this Act would work irreparable harm upon the proper administration of essential government services. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act, being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
