1 State of Arkansas **A BillACT 1000 OF 1991** 2 **78th General Assembly** HOUSE BILL 1590 3 Regular Session, 1991 **By: Representative Argue** 4 5 6 For An Act To Be Entitled 7 "AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION TO 8 DEVELOP GUIDELINES FOR A PROGRAM OF ACADEMIC CLEMENCY; AND 9 FOR OTHER PURPOSES." 10 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 13 14 SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The General Assembly of the State of Arkansas 15 hereby acknowledges that too often, persons enrolled in institutions of higher 16 education do not appreciate the value of their postsecondary educational 17 experience and, following a brief history of poor and failing grades, such 18 persons decide to pursue other worldly pursuits outside the academic world. 19 The General Assembly further finds that following a considerable passage of 20 time, the appreciation for postsecondary educational opportunities increases 21 in such persons to the point that they seek to return to the institution only 22 to find that the grades they acquired during their earlier experience act as a 23 barrier and hinderance to their academic progress. The purpose of this act is 24 to provide a mechanism for institutions of higher education to disregard the 25 records of such persons which prevent or impede their academic success. 26 27 SECTION 2. (a) Beginning with the 1991-92 school year, the State Board 28 of Higher Education in cooperation with the institutions of higher education, 29 shall develop guidelines which may be incorporated into the policies of the 30 colleges and universities that provide for academic clemency for undergraduate 31 students. Under this program of academic clemency, a student returning to a 32 college or university after a separation of a defined number of years may 33 petition the appropriate dean to have previously earned grades and credits 34 removed from the calculations of their cumulative grade point average. Grades 35 and credits earned at any other college or university shall be disregarded 36 under this program.

2 (b) A student enrolled in an institution of higher education on the 3 date of the passage of this act shall be eligible for academic clemency. 4 5 SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 6 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 7 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 8 9 If any provision of this act or the application thereof to SECTION 4. 10 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 11 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 12 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 13 act are declared to be severable. 14 15 SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 16 hereby repealed. 17 SECTION 6. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the 18 19 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly that a statewide effort is being made to 20 adequately train the workforce for the year 2000; that persons who did not 21 consider postsecondary education important following their high school 22 graduation, drop out of postsecondary education only to return at a later 23 stage in their life when they have grown to appreciate such; that a "fresh 24 start" should be given such students to permit them to improve their academic 25 records upon their return to postsecondary education. Therefore, an emergency 26 is hereby declared to exist and this act being necessary for the immediate 27 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and 28 effect from and after its passage and approval. 29 30 /s/James B.
