1 State of Arkansas **A BillACT 338 OF 1991** 2 **78th General Assembly** HOUSE BILL 1547 3 Regular Session, 1991 **By: Representative Horn** 4 5 6 For An Act To Be Entitled 7 "AN ACT REQUIRING PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN ARKANSAS TO IDENTIFY 8 9 ALL CHILDREN WITH SPECIFIC LEARNING DISABILITIES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES." 10 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 13 14 SECTION 1. It is the intent of the General Assembly to identify 15 children with specific learning disabilities and to provide training for 16 teachers encountering children with these problems in the regular classroom. 17 The intent is not to increase the identification of students in special 18 education, but rather to increase the ability of teachers to meet the needs of 19 these students in the regular classroom. 20 21 SECTION 2. As used in this act, the term "specific learning disability" 22 means a disorder in one or more of the basic psychological processes involved 23 in understanding or in using language, spoken or written, which may manifest 24 itself in an imperfect ability to listen, think, speak, write, spell, or to do 25 mathematical calculations. The term includes such conditions as perceptual 26 handicaps, brain injury, minimal brain dysfunction, dyslexia, and 27 developmental aphasia. The term does not include children who have learning 28 problems which are primarily the result of visual, hearing or motor handicaps, 29 of mental retardation, or of environmental, cultural or economic disadvantage. 30 31 SECTION 3. The State Department of Education shall adopt rules and 32 regulations requiring all public schools in the state to identify all children 33 with specific learning disabilities. 34 SECTION 4. The State Department of Education shall develop an in-35 36 service program to train teachers in the recognition of children with specific

1 learning disabilities and in teaching strategies for those students. 2 Districts are required to keep on file in their school district a plan for 3 implementing the recognition of children with specific learning disabilities 4 and for incorporating teaching strategies for those students in the regular 5 classroom. 6 7 SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 8 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 9 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 10 11 SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 12 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 13 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 14 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 15 act are declared to be severable. 16 SECTION 7.
