11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
12	
13	SECTION 1. This act may be cited as the "Arkansas Final Disposition
14	Rights Act."
15	
16	SECTION 2. (a) An individual of sound mind and eighteen (18) or more
17	years of age may execute at any time a declaration governing the final
18	disposition of their bodily remains at their death provided such is in
19	accordance with existing laws, rules and practices for disposing of human
20	remains. The declaration shall be signed by the declarant, or another at the
21	declarant's direction, and shall be witnessed by two (2) individuals.
22	(b) No person having possession, charge, or control of the declarant's
23	human remains following the death of a person who has executed a declaration
24	of final disposition shall knowingly dispose of the body in a manner
25	inconsistent with such declaration.
26	
27	SECTION 3. Nothing in this act shall be construed to affect, repeal or
28	replace, the provisions and procedures set forth in A.C.A. §§20-17-601 et seq.
29	the Arkansas Anatomical Gift Act.
30	
31	SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
32	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
33	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
34	
35	SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
36	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect

1 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
 2 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
 3 act are declared to be severable.

         SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
 6 hereby repealed.
         SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
 8
 9 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly that current law provides for the giving of
10 anatomical gifts upon death but otherwise nothing in the law provides a legal
11 mechanism in which a person can indicate their wishes concerning the disposal
12 of their remains upon death; that cremation has become an acceptable means of
13 disposing of such remains to some persons but there is a reluctance on the
14 part of funeral planners and relatives to honor such option following the
15 passing of the person; that this act will provide such funeral planners with a
16 clear indication to be honored upon the death of the declarant; and that no
17 guarantee exists that a person who would want to avail themselves of the
18 provisions of this act will still be around on its effective date if it does
19 not become effective immediately. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared
20 to exist and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
21 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
22 after its passage and approval.
